
Quilt Show News

QUILT SHOW NEWS YOU CAN USE

Make a note right now: the next quilt show meeting is Thursday, June 16 at 1:00 pm at the Grace Mellman Library in Temecula. Join us and become a major cog in the wheel of the most public event the guild puts on!

All forms and the quilt show flyer are on the website right now, under the Quilt Show heading. Just click on "Quilt Show" and go from there. You will need only one form to display quilts in the show, but you will need an individual form for each quilt/ item you donate to the Live Auction and/or the Silent Auction.

Helping others: The three local charities the guild will sponsor with a portion of the Live Auction proceeds are as follows:



- 2) The Temecula Community Food Pantry, which provides food, clothing and sundries to locals in need all year round;
- **3) Round Up Hope**, a local organization which provides equestrian therapy for special needs children and adults and their families. This group also rescues horses, which are then used in the program.

All of these organizations are 501(c)(3) charities greatly in need of our donation.



- 1) Plan to show your quilts in the show. The more thoroughly we blanket Old Town with our colorful quilts, the more successful the show, and the more our reputation as a destination event grows. This is really important, because it brings in more people who shop our vendors, Old Town Merchants, and buy our auction wares.
- 2) Equally important is our ability to organize and pull off all aspects of this show, from display to vendors, to our auctions, both live and silent. For this, we really need a lot of help! If you're new to the guild and want to get more involved and make some good friends, please join us at our next meeting. We can always use your help in the run-up to the show as well as on the day itself.
- 3) Please plan to make one or more quilts to put into the Live Auction. Remember, you can set the price, and receive up to 50% back if you so choose. If you are planning to contribute a quilt or other item to either auction, please let one of us know! Pretend for a minute that you are the person responsible for ensuring there are enough quilts to auction in October (we need between 40 and 50 for the Live Auction). Now pretend you don't know whether you'll have enough or any to auction until the month before the show. Think of the stress! So if you are planning to make auction quilts—even just one—feel free to let us know! We'd appreciate the update.
- 4) The Silent Auction has been expanded from just small quilts (smallish wall hangings and table mats) to include table runners, aprons and bags (totes and handbags). We're pretty excited about the possibilities, and we hope you'll make something to donate. Special thanks to Annette Fecteau, who has found a couple of wonderful small wall hangings on eBay and bought them solely to donate to the Silent Auction!

Thanks for reading this to the end. I know the Quilt Show update gets repetitive. And thanks also for being a part of the guild. We hope you'll want to be involved with the quilt show!

HELP A VET!

As you may know, I have made it my personal mission to make as many twin-size bed quilts as possible for the formerly homeless veterans being housed at March Air Reserve Base. The guild has decided to get involved and our Philanthropy Committee is planning to make as many as they can. Several individuals have contacted me to express their interest in helping, and have asked me to post the measurements for quilts needed. I thank each of you for your interest and philanthropic spirit!

Size Guidelines: Quilts should be a minimum of 64" wide, but can be up to about 78" wide, and at least 80" long. If you want to make yours longer, that is fine. We just want to make sure the quilt will reasonably cover a twin bed, which is why a lap quilt won't do. I don't know if there are any XL twin beds there, so some additional length might be a good thing.

Quilts should be manly—which is just to say, not juvenile/childlike or feminine/floral. I'm sure guys like a colorful quilt as much as the next person, so they need not be boring and brown. Flannel on the back is okay if that is what you have or want to do.

The quilts, once donated, will become the property of the individual recipient. If that man moves away from March, for whatever reason, the quilt goes with him. It is a gift to an individual. Hopefully these quilts will provide many years of warmth and comfort for each man.

A Gentle Note on Quality: Please remember that our philanthropic quilts are destined for those most in need: babies, abused children and women, disaster victims, the homeless. These recipients need our most carefully made, most special quilts. Let's make these quilts with extra care, to honor these men who have struggled in ways we have not experienced ourselves, in ways we have not had to. Let's pretend the recipients are our sons, our grandsons. Let's make quilts that honor their service and their heroic efforts to rejoin society at large. Let's make them with love, and a generous spirit.



Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2016: Block #6

Block is due at the September meeting.

This month we are continuing our black, white, grey, and one color of your choice palette. We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep. This block is pretty simple, but be accurate on your seams and sew a scant quarter inch. The block is called It's All About Me, Myself, and I by Christopher Thompson.

Cutting Instructions (for one block):

- ¥ Cut one 3.5" x 3.5" Black square
- ¥ Cut one 3.5" x 6.5" Color strip
- ¥ Cut one 3.5" x 9.5" White strip
- ¥ Cut one 6.5" x 9.5" White rectangle
- ¥ Cut one 3.5" x 12.5" Grey strip



General Instructions:

Following the block photo, using a 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the Color strip to the Black square to create the "i" piece. Press.

- ¥ Sew the White strip to the left of the "i" piece.
- ¥ Sew the White rectangle to the right side of the "i" piece.
- ¥ Sew the Grey strip to the top of the "i" block.
- ¥ Trim the block to 12.5" x 12.5".

Hope you enjoy making this block and even though it is a simple block, it can make a wonderful quilt if you play with the orientation of the block.

Our Hispanic Heritage



Heritage" is defined as the customs and traditions that are handed down from generation to generation of families and society. Hispanic culture is prevalent throughout beautiful California from the Spanish architecture we see all around us to the names of many of our cities and streets. Jane Tenorio-Coscarelli will be our featured quilter at the 2016 quilt show. She is known for her colorful quilts depicting Hispanic themes, plus National Hispanic Heritage month runs from September 15th to October 15th...right in line with September meeting and our quilt show. We will be celebrating by making this the theme for our 2016 Valley of the Mist Challenge Quilts.

Rules

- ***** Entry must be a new quilt created especially for this challenge.
- The quilt theme must be a clear representation of some aspect of Hispanic heritage. For example, architecture, food, traditions, holidays, color, etc.
- Quilt may be pieced, appliqued, or drawn. Art mediums may be used such as fabric paints, watercolor pencils or crayons or ink.
- 🔅 Quilt may be an original design or made using a published pattern.
- Name your quilt and pin a 3x5 card to the front telling us more about it. Your name may not be on this card and the label on the back will be covered.
- Quilt must be labeled on the back with the name of the quilt, indicating whether design is original or pattern. Should a published pattern be used, note the name of the pattern and the designer. Include your name and date of completion.
- Finished quilts will be displayed at the September 13th meeting where members will vote. There will be three ribbons awarded: best interpretation of theme, best use of color, and most innovative. Winners will be announced at September meeting and will be on display at the quilt show in Old Town
- ** Challenge chairperson will hold all of the quilts for display at the quilt show in Old Town on October 1st. Quilts will be available for pickup on quilt show day at 4:00 pm or at the November 9th guild meeting.

MODERN QUILTS: REDESIGNING TRADITIONS (Call for Entries)

Thursday, December 1, 2016 through Sunday, January 22, 2017 Ontario Museum of History & Art: 225 S. Euclid Avenue, Ontario, CA 91762

The Modern quilt movement is nearly a decade old and its proponents are a fast growing segment of the quilting population*. Modern quilting began as an online community in the early 2000s and quickly grew into an international movement of like-minded sewists who make that are primarily functional (as opposed to quilts made primarily as "art"). Inspired by modern

quilts that are primarily functional (as opposed to quilts made primarily as "art"). Inspired by modern design, the use of bold colors and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid color, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive use of negative space, and alternate grid work are key elements of this style. Most of these characteristics are not found in "Traditional" quilt design, the formal, pattern-based repetitive blocks of printed fabric set in rows, with an emphasis on construction precision, practiced by most quilters in the 20th Century. This tension between classic, traditional and modern quilt design has lessened in recent years as modern quilters consider traditional patterns in new and exciting ways. This "Modern Traditionalism", the redesign of classic quilt designs, is what we will explore in an exhibit of 40 + juried quilts from U.S. and International quilters. 
