2022 Guild Program Presenters

<u>Susy Nash</u> Jan 11, 2022 Lecture: Value of Colors, Shading for Depth & Dimension; Jan 12, 2022 Workshop: The Teeny Tiny Featherweight #5

Susy has been a certified Laura Heine Instructor since 2018. Prior to that she was working in the healthcare field, but her love of quilting and creativity drew her to train as a Laura Heine instructor. In 2019, soon after finishing her training, she received a call from Laura herself asking if she would be able to teach in Costa Mesa, California. Susy was terrified but she did it and it went very well. That was the start of her teaching career. Since then, she has been off and running. She teaches several classes and workshops.

<u>Shelley Swanland</u> Mar 8, 2022 Lecture: Cathedral Windows and Beyond Trunk Show; Mar 9, 2022 Workshop: Cathedral Windows Sampler

Shelley has been involved in quilting and embroidering since the 70's. In the late 90's she developed a technique for Cathedral Window quilts done entirely by machine. She has published two books and appeared on Simply Quilts and has had work featured in McCall's Quilting, Quiltmaker, and The Quilter. She has designed quilts for RJR Fashion Fabrics and Robert Kaufman Fabrics.

<u>Lyn Brown</u> Apr 12, 2022 Lecture: Modern + Traditional: Moditionals; Apr 13, 2022 Workshop: T-shirt Quilt

Lyn Brown has been teaching quilting for more than 20 years. In 2000, she joined the faculty of North Orange County Community College District. Lyn taught five quilting classes a week for the college district, reaching over 200 students. Her projects came fast and furious, including swaps, mysteries, reproduction, and contemporary with a little bit of art thrown in. Her lecture, Modern and Traditional: Moditional Quilts, explores the modern movement in quilt making with an eye on tradition. There are many hallmarks of modern quilts. The Workshop will show you all the tricks of stabilizing, settings, and borders.

<u>Linda & Carl Sullivan</u> May 10, 2022 Lecture: Got Colour? The Color Lecture; May 11, 2022 Workshop: Colour Bugs and Curves!

Two techniques in one class! First, Linda will guide you through her liberating and fancy free slash 'n sew technique while making cute colour bugs blocks – no $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams to follow and no rules. Next, she'll guide you through sewing perfect curves with her handy tips and tricks - you're guaranteed to conquer your fear of sewing curves with no tears. Both techniques come together in one class while making this cute ladybug quilt!

Dru Farrell Jun 14, 2022 Speaker: My Journey to Sew Treasured

Block of the Month

Block of the Month 2022: Block #8

To get started, here are the fabrics you need: your focus fabric, two coordinating fabrics based on the colors in the focus fabric, and a white fabric. Pick ones that contrast with each other. Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.) These blocks are not due until September.

Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.



Fabric 1 (white fabric) -- Four 5" squares

Focus fabric & Coordinating Fabrics (up to 3, use the focus fabric for at least one of the squares. We used three different coordinating fabrics, but you can use a fabric twice.)

- Four 5" squares total
- Four 2.75" X 5.25" strips (one of each fabric) if you are repeating a fabric, you can use a 3.75" square

Assembling the block: Use a quarter inch seam

• The first thing to do is cut the triangles for the center of the block. If you are using a coordinating or the focus fabric twice in this block or if you plan to make two of these blocks you can just use 3.75" square pieces of fabric and cut them on the diagonal to get the triangles needed. If you just need one of each color, use a 2.75" X 5.25" strip, fold it in half to get 2.75"

X 2.625" rectangle. Cut on the diagonal to remove two corners and you should end up with your triangle (photo 2.) Decide the order of the colors for your final block. Using the four small triangles,


arrange them with points touching and hypotuneses facing out. Sew two adjacent triangles together, press the seam open, sew the other two together and press open. Then sew the center seam and press open. Trim off flags at edge of the piece – it should be about 4.5" square.

- Next, we make half square triangles. On the wrong side of your white fabric squares draw a diagonal line between two corners. Pair each white square with a square of colored fabric, right sides together. Sew each of these pairs together by sewing a quarter inch seam on each side of your diagonal lines. Cut each set into two by cutting on the drawn line. Press to the darker fabric.
- Refer to the final block and arange all the pieces so they match the look of the final block. Sew each row together, and press the seams open. Check the rows to see if they are roughly 4.5"

wide. If all are wider than 4.5", you can trim the center row down to 4.5" or sew them together with a generous quarter inch seam. If they are narrower, plan to sew smaller seams when we sew these together. Sew the three rows together to make the final block. Press to lay flat.

• The final step is to square it up. Use your $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " square up ruler, place it over the block. Make sure there is fabric under all parts of the ruler and trim to $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Local Quilter Semifinalist in International Quilt Show

Paducah, Kentucky, USA – Kathleen Silva from Murrieta is a semifinalist for the 2022 AQS QuiltWeek® – Des Moines, Iowa held September 14 – 17, 2022, at the Iowa Events Center. Kathleen has been chosen to display the quilt, My Cousin is a Chicken, along with 227 others in this AQS contest. First, Second, and Third Place prizes in seven categories will be awarded, along with seven overall awards including Best of Show. Winners will be announced at the show and posted on the AQS website, Americanquilter.com. More than \$50,000 will be granted, including \$10,000 for the Best of Show and \$3,500 each for Best Wall Quilt, Best Traditional Design, Best Original Design, Best Hand, Best Stationary, and Best Movable Workmanship. Regardless of how My Cousin is a Chicken places in the final judging, all semifinalist quilts will be displayed at the show.

AQS President Bill Schroeder says, "AQS has a longstanding history of having the best of the best quilts in our contests. Just when we think the quality of the quilts can't get any better, quilters step up their creativity even more and set a new standard of quiltmaking. This year's contests are no exception and these quilts are truly exceptional."

Quilts were entered in this international contest from 40 US states and 13 countries. Come see a wide range of special exhibit quilts including: New Quilts from an Old Favorite: Wheel of Fortune; The Diana Cherrywood Challenge Exhibit; SAQA: Wide Horizons VII; The Ties That Bind Us curated by Wendy Brackman; along with a variety of quilts from the West Michigan Quilters Guild.

The American Quilter's Society hosts several shows annually, each Des Moines, Iowa show, AQS hosts other prestigious shows in Dayt Missouri: Paducah, Kentucky; and Grand Rapids, Michigan.


