



Monthly Mini

Hello All,

Maureen Nelson here for November Monthly Mini, and Just wait until you see what a beautiful mini awaits you this month. Designed by Dot Demmin, the block is machine pieced and hand quilted on beautiful batiks. At first glance, you are impressed by the expert and precise piecing and the unique pattern. Then the fabrics "take over" and conjure up a sort of safari and wild animal feel that you can't keep your eyes off of! The colors are a combination of golds, which give me the feeling of sunset on the Serengeti, and browns and tans, combined in "animal like" prints, that brings out the wild beasts that just might roam within. The fabric choices and placement, give the piece an almost hypnotic movement, that captures your attention. The large center square has randomly placed embroidered work that echos the fabric design, and looks a bit like dandelions to me. (Those "lions" won't roar or bite, so It's safe to hang this beauty on your wall).

The mini comes ready to hang, complete with a wooden dowel.

Quilter of the Month

Quilter of the Month Pat Jordan

Pat was born in New Orleans. Her father, a Pearl Harbor survivor, was stationed there, and then was stationed in Connecticut. In

1951 they moved to the San Diego Claremont area, where they continued to live for many years. Her dad worked at Scripps Institute until he retired. In 1968 Pat started working in the University system in the Scripps Institute also, where she stayed until retirement in 2005. However, she returned to 43% work because they needed her skills, and currently is Assistant to the Deputy Director for research. Pat loves the work, as she finds it mentally challenging and she gets to work with high level people who are also amazingly good people. They have a 30 million dollar budget and a staff of 17 and do important, sometimes classified, work.

Pat also spent 25 years as a volunteer to the Boy Scouts. She was the first Scout Master for the National Group Training program which she also developed. The youth are trained in leadership in what has grown to 5 courses. It is an on-going program. She received many awards from the Scouts including: Order of the Arrow, Silver Beaver, Cross Feather, Founder's Award and others.

Pat is an avid sportswoman. Her sports have included: softball, soccer, rubber raft racing with teams of 7, archery (on the CA Women's team with Gina Davis, beating Arizona), long distance bike riding (as up Mammoth Mountain!) She quit the bike riding after a severe accident that involved being hit by a car.

She met her beloved husband, Jordy, in 1970. They were married in 1976 and were blessed to have their son. Ryan in 1980. By the way, Ryan became an Eagle Scout and was active in Boy Scouts for a long time.

Pat's mother was a fabulous seamstress and made her Rainbow Girl gowns in all colors as well as other beautiful garments. When Pat was 10, her mother began teaching her to sew. Pat took Home Ec. where she learned a lot of techniques. Eventually she made clothes for the family, including for Jordy and Ryan.

After retiring the first time, she decided she wanted to quilt. She was visiting a friend in Oregon who quilted and showed her basics. In 2 days Pat made her 1st quilt, which astonished her friend. Pat was so excited, and immediately upon returning home to Anza, began looking for a guild. She couldn't find one in Anza, but she heard about Valley of the Mist, came and joined. Pat loves, loves, loves the classes and learning how to do things. She says she doesn't even mind the drive, and hopes she can continue driving at night so she can keep coming.

Her favorite technique is appliqué. Right now she is enjoying learning wool appliqué, which she finds so much easier as you don't turn under the edges. When they added a new master suite to their home, she took over the old one for her sewing studio. As she finishes her board duties, she is preparing to finish 25 UFO's, which she has organized into project boxes! Pat loves our guild so much. She has served in many positions, and looks forward to a year where all she has to do is the president's quilt and help with Show and Tell. What a blessing to have her in our guild. She has such incredible talents, energy, skills and heart.



Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2016: Block #11

Block is due at the December meeting.

This month's block is called Stacked not Wacked. Remember we are using a black, white, grey, and one color of your choice palette for our fabrics this year. We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the monthly drawing to win all the blocks turned in and one to keep. Please be accurate on your seams and sew a scant quarter inch. Our instructions are for making one block, but it is very easy to make two blocks.


Cutting Instructions (for one block):

Black: One 3 1/2" X 5 1/2" rectangle Color: One 3 1/2" X 7 1/2" rectangle One 3 1/2" X 5 1/2" rectangle

White: Cut one 3 1/2" strip (you need 31 inches);

Subcut the strip into:

One 3 1/2" X 10 1/2" rectangle Two 3 1/2" X 7 1/2" rectangles One 3 1/2" X 5 1/2" rectangle Grey: One 3 1/2" X 2 1/2" rectangle




General Instructions:

Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance throughout. Refer to the photos when sewing the pieces.

- 1. Stitch together the 3½ wide pieces in vertical columns as follows:
- 5½" color piece to 7½" white piece
- 10½" white piece to the 2½" grey piece
- 5½" white piece to 7½" color piece
- 7½" white piece to the 5½" black piece
- 2. Press seams to the darker fabric.
- 3. Stitch the pieces together along the 12½" edge referring to the image for placement.
- 4. Press and trim the block to 12½" x 12½".

Note from Nancy Ota:

Hi,

I received a couple excellent questions, may this explanation help.

I do prewash fabric in my machine and use Orvus detergent, warm cycle. A friend suggests pinking the edge to keep the fraying down. I run it through the dryer, and it comes out pretty soft. It is a medium weight fabric, and heavier than broadcloth. The blue does run. Actually, some times I like fabric to be a bit stiff, especially silk. Silk can get wiggly. Hanging to drip dry does leave fabric stiffer.

I tape the pattern down on a light table using drafting tape. Drafting tape is pretty kind to paper and peels off easier. Then I tape the fabric on top of the pattern. I trace the pattern using white chalk pencil on dark fabrics. I may occasionally shut off the light to see where I have traced. Keeping the fabric and pattern taped helps to keep things in line. If your light table is small, I would tape the fabric and pattern together so they can be moved together to get to the light.

A light table may be as simple as a glass top table with a lamp underneath. I have seen end tables at thrift shops that would work. Some have a glass dining room table that offers a large space for tracing. I have used a piece of glass or clear acrylic over two TV trays to make a light surface.


