
Block of the Month

Page 1

Block of the Month: Block 8--blocks due at the September meeting

This next block it great. It is a little more difficult, but the completed block looks wonderful. We are still using our neutal color palette. The colors shown in the these instructions are for illustration only. There is a picture below on the right and additional information about the palette is in the January 2015 newsletter. All blocks are 12.5" blocks — 12" finished. Check out the blog http://www.sewmamasew.com/ for more ideas There are lots of partial seams in this block, and the small pieces can be a touch finicky. But just take care to follow the directions step by step, and be mindful and diligent in your piecing, and you'll manage the block with no problems. Before you know it you'll have wrapped your brain around the concept of partial seams and knowing how they work will open up your design options!

With all of these seams, it's very important to keep a scant 1/4" seam allowance so that your block finishes at 12.5" square.



Fabric Requirements: (If making two blocks -double this.)

Fabric A: 1.5" x 23.5" scrap Fabric B: 1.5" x 15.5" scrap

Fabric C: 1.5" x 10" scrap Fabric D:1.5" WOF strip, 4.5" x 5.5" scrap, 6.5" x 8.5" scrap

Assembling the Block: Press between every step.

 First, sew together the portions of the block that don't require any partial seams.

Assemble D1, A1, D2 and then A2 to create P1

Assemble D3, B2, D5 and then A3 to create P2


Assemble D10, C2, D11 and then A5 to create P3


Assemble D7 and A4 to create P4

Assemble C4, D16 and then D17 to create P5

Assemble B5, D15 and then D13 and D18 to create P6


Now we'll move on to sewing some partial seams. The directions clearly indicate just where to do this. When you sew a partial seam, sew half way across, about 3/4" of an inch along. I find this gives you the right balance of enough seam sewn and enough left unsewn to work with later.

Marci is a Southern California original. She was born in Lynwood and graduated from Bell High School. She went to Mt. San Antonio College, but marriage and family came along, so she decided to finish her degree later.

She loved sewing and for awhile, Marci was a seamstress, even making her own wedding dress in 1970. Out of necessity she sewed a lot of children's clothes once her family came along. She sewed them a wide range of garments, from tee shirts to Laura Ashley. She taught others to sew in vocational sewing classes in the public school system. Marci's first experience in quilting came in the 70's when she taught "crazy quilting" to 7th graders, however, she did not continue down the quilting journey at that time.

Marci says that her background is in the field of arts. She is a retired art teacher who dearly loved the years she spent teaching. Marci also did a lot of mural painting in homes and businesses and painted backdrops for school theater plays.

She is a fairly new quilter. It was a magazine that inspired her. In 2002 her beloved mother in-law passed on. Going through her things, she found a 1960's magazine with a quilt pattern that inspired Marci to make her first quilt, "Oak Leaf Real". The nostalgia drew her into quilting and changed her entire direction in the field of arts. Marci bought a long arm machine, as she loves the design element added to a quilt by the quilting. She has now quilted over 300 quilts, and won "Best of Show" for quilting in the Hemet/San Jacinto Quilt Show.

Marci is ever expanding, and has added photography to her repertoire. It began after she and her husband (also a quilter) retired and began travelling to various parts of the world. She took some classes in photography, bought a Nikon camera and away she went to — Jamaica, Alaska, Canada, the East Coast, and most of the United States. Marci especially loves wild life and historical buildings as her subjects. Her goal is to marry the two skills and turn some of her photos into quilts.

In 2010, Marci and her sister, Diana White, walked through our doors and entered this wonderful quilt world and are so happy they did it. Like others in the Guild, she has donated many quilts for auction and philanthropy. Marci is currently the Historian and Photographer for the Guild. She has served on the Quilt Show Committee and on the Auxiliary Board. We look forward to seeing her new projects in the years ahead.

Quilts may be machine or hand pieced, quilted or appliquéd, embellished, framed, traditional or contemporary, hanging sleeve or not. A label with your name, city & date is a welcome addition.

<u>Table Runner Donations</u>: This year we will also accept table runners for the silent auction. Table runners may be any size that would fit on an ordinary dining table. Some ideas are holiday variations, or seasonal colors & fabrics (think spring or fall) & these may be machine or hand pieced, machine or hand appliqued & machine or hand quilted. 


