Hello Quilters!



# Quilter of the Month Maureen Nelson

Our December Quilter of the Month, Maureen Nelson, was born in Escondido, California where she lived for 50 years! Her full and busy life included raising her children in Escondido, the epicenter of her life.

Maureen has always worked in the optical field. For 25 years she has been the optical manager for Costco. Twelve years ago she moved to Murrieta and currently is the optical manager at Costco in Temecula.

She told me that she has always sewn, but did not always quilt, in fact quilting was added to her life very recently. At a Costco staff meeting, Tawnya O'Herron spoke about quilts. This piqued Maureen's interest and Tawnya invited her to visit our guild. It was love at first sight. Maureen took a block of the month class at Craftsy and joined the guild. That was about 3 years ago.

Maureen loves modern quilt designs and colors. She was an art major at San Diego State and the modern style appeals to her.

She and Tawnya took on the job of our dog bed program. When she visited shelters, she was told they did not want the kind we first made as they were lumpy and bunched up and could not be washed. So, she morphed the project into pet mats that can be washed. These flat mats with 2 layers of batting sewn inside fabric now total over 200 a year! They put together kits for members to take home and finish and return. The first delivery was 100 pet bed mats!!

At the Ramona shelter in Hemet, her heart was broken as it is a kill shelter. It was full of pit bulls staring sadly at her. A customer of Maureen's, Marianne, told her that she takes dogs out of kill shelters and finds them homes. Of course Maureen then blessed her and her project with some of our pet pads, which Marianne puts into crates so that they go with the dogs to their new homes.

Maureen has two children and five grandchildren, two dogs and a cat. She adores making them quilts, loves to play tennis, is a dedicated gardener (even has plumeria growing in many colors), and works 10-11 hour days. She tries to quilt in between all this in her gorgeous quilt studio that includes a sit down longarm and state of the art sewing machine. She is so organized that all of her stash is wrapped, sorted by color and stands up on shelves. Wow! I'm impressed.

She says "I have 20 moons until I can retire." Then she plans to travel, camp (says she's outdoorsy), take grandchildren on trips, take classes at the guild, and start a modern quilt guild. Seems like she's planning to continue those 10-11 hour days when she "retires."


#### Block of the Month: Block 12-blocks due at the January meeting

Here is our last block -- I have love working on all these blocks with you this year. We are still using our neutal color palette. The colors shown in the these instructions are for illustration only. There is a picture below on the right and additional information about the palette is in the January 2015 newsletter. All blocks are 12.5" blocks — 12" finished. Don't forget, check out the modern quilt blog Sew Mama Sew at http://www.sewmamasew.com/ to see all their great ideas.

This month we have another block that's great for beginners.

Have you mastered your 1/4" seam yet? This is a great block to really work at getting it right with because your block will turn out the wrong size if it's not just right.







Fabric Requirements: Note the background fabric is fabric C (If making two blocks --double this.)

Fabric A (print): 12.5" x 4" scrap

Fabric B (print): 12.5" x 5" scrap

Cut List: For one 12.5" x 12.5" block

A1 = 12.5" x 1.5" A2 = 12.5" x 2.5"

B1 = 12.5" x 2" B2 = 12.5" x 3" C1 = 1.5" x 7.5"

C2 = 2.5" x 7.5" C3 = 3.5" x 7.5"

D1 = 3.5" x 7.5" D2 = 3.5" x 7.5"

# A1 A2 B1 B2


Fabric C (background): 7.5" x 7.5" scrap

Fabric D (print): 7" x 7.5" scrap

#### Assembling the Block:


Sew with a 1/4" seam allowance.

1. Working left to right, assemble C1, D1, C2, D2 and C3.



2. Cut this piecing into five 1.5" portions.

Tip: If you're making a lot of this block, consider piecing WOF (width of fabric) strips of the correct widths for this step. You can get enough pieces for 5 blocks in one go this way.

3. Now, working top to bottom, assemble these portions with A1, B1, A2 and B2 working in the order indicated in the diagram. Press well and your block is all finished! So simple!

Enjoy sewing up this quick block!



- HOSPITALITY: This crew sets up our hospitality table with drinks and member's snacks. There is a budget to provide for purchases. Some supplies need to be transported (coffee pot, cups, etc). Perfect for a friendship group to take turns or help each other. There is a special set up for our birthday meeting in September and our annual holiday potluck in December to oversee.






