
I will continue to collect items for the rest of the year. My year end goal is to give each veteran a pillowcase, and I am happy to say I have already collected 25.

Join us at the sew-in Saturday at Heritage Mobile Home Park. Our next meeting is May 30th from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.




#### **Block of the Month**

Page 1

#### Block of the Month: Block 5-blocks due at the July meeting due to brown bag auction

Here is our next block. We are still using our neutal color palette. The colors shown in these instructions are for illustration only. There is a picture below on the right and additional information about the palette is in the January 2015 newsletter. All blocks are 12.5" blocks — 12" finished



#### **Block of the Month**

Page 2

Sew the two columns of piecing together, lining up the colorful strips so that they are centered in the background fabric (Fabric A) strips from the opposite column.





3. Now turn the piecing at a 45 degree angle and trim down to 12.5" square. Make sure that your upper left and lower right corners fall on the center seam of the piecing, this will put the center seam on the 45 degree angle line.

Tip: This is another block ideal for a 12.5" square ruler. If you don't have a ruler like that consider drawing the block onto the piecing before making your first cut. You wouldn't want to cut one edge incorrectly and not be able to get a full 12.5" square block out of the piecing.



#### Quilter of the Month

Celebrating Quilter of the Month

**Bonnie Hallett** 

Meet amazing Bonnie, one incredible quilter. She has conquered most of the quilting skills and is working on the rest. You can tell by looking at the photos how masterful she is.

Bonnie was born and raised in San Diego, as were her parents and her grandparents! Another unique family fact is that the entire family is military—yes everyone. Bonnie is an Army Veteran. In the Army she

gained computer skills which led to a career in computers, first at Fed Mart then
Sony, a career that spanned 30 years. She has 2 children, 3 step children, 11
grandchildren, 7 great grandchildren, and husband, Wayne, (you can see part of the
humorous quilt she made for him on the bottom left).

As with so many of us, her sewing life began with her grandmother. She was 5 when her grandmother started helping her. They would shop for fabric and pattern, and by the end of the week-end Bonnie would have a new outfit. She said if she had to learn sewing at school, she would never have gone on because it was so slow and boring in Home Ec! She continued to sew clothes through high school, for Rainbow Girls, prom dresses, really all of her clothes.

Off to college, she bought a little sewing machine and decided she really wanted to make a quilt. But in 1972 there were no teachers and lots of polyester and all she knew were 5/8" seams. So she picked the hardest pattern (see black and white star below to see the pattern) and proceeded with 5/8" seams to

make it—but it had holes in the centers. She carried that flawed, but loved quilt around with her for a long time. She decided maybe cross stitch would work out better and made a 5 foot wide nativity scene that took 1 entire year working 4 to 6 hours a day. A magnificent creation, but it said to her that no quilt could possibly take that long.

Fortuitously Peggy Martin was offering a quilting class at Palomar College. It called to Bonnie and she answered, and quilting took off like a rocket ship for her. She mastered all basic skills in these classes which she took for 10 years, and then she expanded into all kinds of quilting. She joined Friendship Quilters in Poway.

When they moved to Sunshine Summit, she started a quilting group there so that she'd have playmates. Every Monday Bonnie teaches quilting and organizes a yearly quilting and arts show there. She started Prayers and Squares at her church. About 5 years ago she came back to our guild (she had briefly been here years ago) and started bringing members of her group in Sunshine Summit. She lives so far away (38 miles) that she cannot be on committees, but she participates mightily by quilting for philanthropy, helping at our quilt show and donating large quilts to the auction which usually are the biggest ticket sales each year.

What makes Bonnie's heart sing are graphic quilts that have dimensionality without actually having dimension. For examples look at the top right of this page. Also she loves sashing that does something.

Right now she is learning custom quilting on her new baby, the APQS Millie. She just loves it. At Road this year, she fell in love with this machine and was ready to say good-bye to her old one (which was not that old and is for sale by the way). She has been longarming about 11 years and doing it professionally for 6 years. She did only hand quilting until she got her first Handiquilter 11 years ago. It has been 40 years since that first

wonky quilt and 30 years + since her first class. She always wanted to make a quilt. Look at her now! Wow!!!




