**P.S.** – If you are out garment shopping and are at the check out – please ask for a few extra pants and skirt hangers to use for hanging the Philanthropy Quilts at the show.

## **Quilt Show News**



NEXT QUILT SHOW MEETING IS FRIDAY, AUGUST 18 AT 1PM AT THE GRACE MELLMAN LIBRARY IN TEMECULA.

**VOLUNTEERS**: The quilt show is coming, and sooner than you think! We need more volunteers! For the next two general meetings, Marilyn Matteson will be circulating with a clipboard to sign up volunteers. She will also be calling and emailing members.

**POSTCARDS:** We hand out bundles of quilt show postcards between the August meeting and the quilt show. The postcards advertise the quilt show and the auctions. Please take at least 3 bundles (of 25 each) and distribute them. Note: you do NOT have to find 75 people to hand these to. All you need to do is leave an entire bundle at 3 different places where you do business, like your beauty salon, your nail salon, your dentist, your doctor's office, outlying quilt shops you may visit. Remember: leave the whole bundle—so you only need to leave them at three locations!

**DISPLAY FORMS:** Your display forms are due to Gail or Rita AT THE AUGUST MEETING, or snail-mailed or scanned and emailed to Gail. It is really important to get these in because planning where to hang all those quilts is a big job and takes a while. We need lots of display quilts! All quilts qualify to hang, and every one will look beautiful hanging throughout Old Town Temecula.

All auction and direct sale quilts must be turned in at the September meeting with their forms (one form per quilt) safety-pinned to them. The forms are on the website and will also be on the information table by Membership at the August meeting. Please note the sizes on the forms so you will be sure to put your quilts into the proper categories.

**SHARE LIVE-STREAMING INFORMATION:** We really need all members to share the quilt show information and auction details on their Facebook pages, including that the auction will be live streamed. **I will be sending out email blasts to you all with the details and reminders as we get closer to quilt show day.**

Each year we hang quilts inside of Old Town Temecula businesses for 2 weeks leading up to our quilt show. We try to match requests to quilts as closely as possible, so please look at the list below to see if you might have a quilt or be making one that fits what the merchant wants. If you do, please email me a photo of it and its dimensions. If yours is selected, I will be asking for information for the brochure that the city prints. These need to be quilts not seen in the quilt walk before (except 1 by request, see #19)

#### So here is what I need:

- 1) A traditional quilt up to 20"x20"
- 2) Religious subject matter, any size
- 3) Fruits and/or veggies, up to 6' wide by 4' tall
- 4) Traditional with fall or neutral colors, up to 36" x 36"
- 5) Sweets or abstract any size
- 6) Teas and/or Spices, 26" x 60"
- 7) Wild is fine! Up to twin size
- 8) Any size and any subject
- 9) Up to twin any subject
- 10) Up to 7'x 4' any subject
- 11) Up to twin any subject
- 12) Up to twin any subject
- 13) Up to 48" x 30" roosters or chickens (would like 2)
- 14) Wall hanging any subject
- 15) Wall hanging any subject
- 16) Small wall hanging any subject
- 17) Fall colors, large to drape on piano
- 18) Fall colors, wall hanging, especially olives
- 19) And we have one that requested Shirley's Queen of Diamonds that she had in her store had last year! Way to go Shirley!

Please contact me soon with your entries as the quilts need to be selected and the information given to the city so that they can print the brochure. Thank you so much for playing!

## 2017 Challenge Quilt

#### The Quilt:

- Your challenge is to create a house block quilt. It can be anything from wall hanging to a full size quilt. House blocks or houses must be the main feature so that when viewed it can be clearly defined as a house block quilt.
- It must be a quilt...that is, it must contain a front and back with batting in between and be quilted either by machine or by hand.

**House blocks**... a minimum of 5 houses in the quilt. No maximum.


- Any style house is acceptable.
- Any size block is acceptable
- Any method is acceptable... appliqué, piecing, embroidery, etc.
- Any fabric choice is acceptable but you must use fabric.
- The addition of other blocks of your choice is acceptable.
- Embellishments are acceptable.

### **Block of the Month**

#### Block of The Month 2017: Block #8

Block is due at the September meeting.

This month we are continuing our color scheme for the year: black, white, the monthly birthstone color, and a shade (or tint) of that color. This month's color is light green (peridot), so your second color should be shade of green. Please look at the January newsletter for the color chart. We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep. Please sew with an accurate quarter inch seam.

This block uses improvisational piecing so have fun with it. The only tricky part is when you are piecing together the final three parts; watch to make sure you are lining up the horizontal stripes.



White fabric: one 11 ½" square Black fabric: one 13 ½" X 2" strip

Light green fabric: one 13 1/2" X 2" strip; one 16" X 2" strip

Green shade fabric: one 16" X 2" strip

#### Assembling the block:

Using your rotary cutter and ruler, cut the white square into thirds. Look at the second photo for an idea, but this is improvisation. The cuts don't have to be even or straight and varying the angle makes it more interesting.

Sew the 13  $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 2" strip of light green between the left and middle piece and the 13  $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 2" strip of black between the middle and right piece. Make sure the strips extend beyond the white fabric and line up the white pieces so the tops are roughly even. Press away from the white fabric.


Now turn the block and cut it again in thirds (see photo 2.) Repeat the above steps with the remaining light green and other green 16" strips of fabric. When sewing together, check the alignment of the strips from the last step to make sure they even. Also, check to make sure the inserted strips extend beyond the edges of the block. Press toward the inserted strips.

Using a 12-½" square up ruler, trim to get a 12 ½" block. Repeat to make a second block!

This block is so fun to make and as long as you watch the alignment, it is quick, easy, and beautiful.




