The big day is almost here! Sat Oct 7, 10:am - 4:00 pm

- *Please remember to "like" us on the Guild Facebook page and share posts with all of your social media contacts. The success of our live-streaming and on line bidding depends on members sharing the info.
- *We need help hanging ropes Friday evening 10/6 from 5:00 pm about 7:30 pm. The more helpers, the earlier we will be finished. Bring Ladders or step stools, and men and strong boys to pull the ropes tight. We will meet at the corner of Old Town Front Street and 6th street in front of the Gardeners Cottage.
- The earlier the better as others will need to have your display quilts hung before 10 am. The earlier the better as others will need help after yours are hung. We hang Philanthropy quilts on the Rancon building and there are so many of them that Ida will need lots of help. Gloria is hanging for several people at the Chaparral Building, Shirley will be hanging 28 Challenge quilts at the coin shop area, and the list goes on....cruise around town and see who needs help. Men are needed at the auction site to help hang the 60 auction quilts.
- **Bring ladders and step stools** if possible. There will be binder clips and skirt hangers at Gloria's corner on Front and 6th in front of the Gardeners Cottage and at the large quilt auction site in the theater courtyard.
- *Please do not hang quilts in front of doorways or walkways leading up to doors even though there may be ropes in these spots. Sometimes it is easier to stretch the ropes across doorways & walkways rather than cut them.
- If you are concerned about your quilts getting dirty, you may want to hang a sheet behind them as some of the buildings are a little dusty.
- If possible, wear **blue pants, shorts or skirts, white tops and an apron,** so visitors can identify us and get info from us.
- *Marilyn will be emailing you regarding your **volunteer assignments** and Gail will be emailing regarding your **hanging space** to you about a week to 10 days before the show.
- At the end of the day when taking down your quilts please take down the ropes they hung on if at all possible. You can bring these to the next GM you attend and Gail will collect them. Her family goes through town after the show collecting signs, banners and ropes that are still there but they can use all the help they can get.
- *Your **high school students can get community hours** for helping at the show and hanging and taking down ropes so rally those kids and grandkids.
- Please **no individual selling of quilts at our show.** It creates a liability for the guild and competes with our auctions.

Opportunity Quilt

Our current opportunity quilt **Sweet Tweets** will be awarded to a lucky winner at the end of the large quilt auction on quilt show day, **October 7th**. Our **new 2018 opportunity quilt will be unveiled at our meeting on October 10th**.

The Road to California quilt show will be from Thursday, January 18 to Sunday, January 21, 2018 at the Ontario Convention Center. Road officials have informed me that we will be allowed to sell opportunity quilt tickets at the show on Thursday, January 18, 2018. In order to be permitted to sell tickets we are required to provide 20 hours of white glove volunteers at the show.

If you haven't done this before, I'll explain. You sign up for a 2-hour shift as a white glove docent at the show. I will have sign up sheets at the October and November guild meetings. Road requires that the names and emails of volunteers be turned in to them by the end of November. They allow only 2 people to sign up for the same time slot. You may volunteer for any of the four days of the show. You will receive a wrist band for **free admission** to all four days of the show if you volunteer. Road will provide you with the white gloves and an apron to wear during your shift so that you are easily identifiable to visitors. They will assign you a space to work and you get to touch the quilts and look at the backs. You point out any interesting features to visitors.

I will also need 2 or 3 volunteers to sell **opportunity quilt tickets on Thursday, January 18th**. This job is a **sit down job** if being on your feet for the two hour white glove shift is difficult for you. You still get free admission to the show as a volunteer. **So check your calendars and decide the day you plan to attend the show, then sign up as a volunteer so that our spectacular new opportunity quilt will be able to get to the show.** Gloria Bachmann

Workshops






Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2017: Block #10

Block is due at the November meeting.

This month we are continuing our color scheme for the year: black, white, the monthly birthstone color, and a shade (or tint) of that color. This month's color is pink, so your second color should be a red shade. Please look at the January newsletter for the color chart.

This block is called a water wheel and is a 9 patch variation. We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep. Please sew with an accurate quarter inch. We are using a basic short cut method for the half-square triangle sections. You will need to trim them to size to allow for slight inaccuracies with the various levels of sewers we have. If you are accurate – cut 4 7/8" squares, otherwise we have put 5".



Cut list -- For one block:

From both white & pink fabrics: One 5" squares; Four 2 1/2" squares

From black fabric: Two 5" squares; Eight 2 1/2" squares

From red fabric: Four 2 1/2" squares

Assembling the block:


To make the half square triangle sections, draw a diagonal line on the back of white and pink 5" squares. Place each of these squares right sides together with a black 5" square. Sew ¼" from each side of the drawn line. Cut on the

drawn line. Press to the black. Use a ruler to square up these sections to 4 1/2 " squares.

- Lay out pieces to match photo 3. Assemble the four patches in each corner and the center. Press to the darker fabric. Sew together in rows. Press toward the half square triangles. This will allow you to butt the seams to get a good fit when sewing rows together.
- · Sew rows together.
- Press and using a 12 ½" square up ruler, trim to get a 12 ½" block. Repeat to make a second block!

This is great practice for half square triangles. Have fun!


