GET READY FOR PATT BLAIR!

Patt Blair, not to be confused with Major League Baseball's shortstop Pat Blair, is an artist-turned-quilter, emphasis on the artist. She lives in the mountain community of Mt. Baldy, California, and she is our guest speaker in April.

Pat has been involved in many art forms since she was a teenager, including brush and pen lettering, so you could be forgiven for confusing her with White House

calligrapher Pat Blair. (And who knew there was such a position as "White House calligrapher" anyway?!) In any case, lettering skills aside, Patt was first an oil painter, and then a watercolorist.

She was introduced to quilting by friends she walked regularly with, and, intrigued, she looked into it. Although she has a great appreciation and respect for traditional quilting, Patt says she was "previously ruined" for that approach to quilting by long exposure to the expansive color choices afforded by traditional art media. As a result, she found fabric colors and choices to be very limiting. When she finally discovered a painting-with-dye class in 2001, she realized she could combine fabric with dyes, paints, even inks, and create textile-based works of art that way. By 2003, according to her website, she was "competing and placing in locally and nationally judged contests." Most recently, her art quilt Summer Hunt placed third in the Art, Critter category at Road to California in 2016.

Patt has been teaching her art quilting techniques since 2004, and we are pleased to welcome her to Valley of the Mist Quilters Guild.

PRESIDENT'S APRIL MESSAGE

One of these days I will have enough time to finally get my own sewing room set up to facilitate actual sewing in there. (In the meantime, I set up on the dining room table, like a lot of other people.) I have only finished 4 quilts this year, although I have three others in stages, so I'm looking forward to when I can legitimately say I have seven done.

We have to tackle a review of the guild's bylaws this year. The review committee will be chaired by our Parliamentarian, Shirley

Brown. If you would like to be a part of the review process, please contact Shirley and let her know you are interested. The review may result in changes as minor as correcting typos that somehow got past the reviewers last time, or it may involve significant wording changes. In any case, a copy of the bylaws with all changes clearly marked will be made available for review by each of you.

While pondering the bylaw reviews, I have spent a lot of time considering the bylaws in their entirety, and the primary thing that concerns me is that we not lose sight of the fact that we are, first and foremost, a nonprofit entity. While of course we try to have as much fun as we can each month, and we are an inherently social group, the other two facets of our mission are far more important. Those two goals are to further quilting education in our members and the community at large (through our quilt show, mainly) and to be charitable—doing philanthropic good works. I really couldn't be prouder of the philanthropy work we do, between creating quilts and other items for those in need, but also raising money each year to donate to deserving organizations. As a nonprofit, these two things--education and charitable contributions—should drive us in all we do. I would ask each of you—from those who head up or serve on a committee to those who hold a board position, as well as those of you who come each month to enjoy the various speakers--to keep these goals in mind as you go about the work of the guild.

Thank you for all your donations to the ladies in need at our local domestic violence shelter, as well as your donations to our Basket Bonanza fundraiser in June. They are greatly appreciated!

Please consider coming to the monthly Philanthropy Committee meetings. They can always use extra help, whether you help cut kits or sew blocks together or put bindings on. In fact it's pretty amazing how much work gets done with so little help. Yes! We need YOU! Also, please keep Philanthropy in mind as you sort things in your sewing room. If you conclude you will never get a kit sewn up or figure out what to do with a collection of fabric, hand it off to Philanthropy. Trust me, they'll figure it out, and they always need good fabric to use. If you have unused "masculine" fabrics you won't use, hand them off to Karen and Ida! "Masculine" fabrics do not have to depict a 68-point buck posing alertly in the forest—they mostly just need to NOT be feminine or juvenile.

Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2018: Block #4

April is here and so is block #4. This block is due at the May meeting. This is another nine-patch variation, but we were inspired by last month's speaker, Jean Impey. This is a simple friendship star variation but we are making simple by just cutting off the corners to make the star. This goes together really fast and if you are having trouble – you are thinking too hard!

The fabrics you need this month are our focus fabric -- Effervescence - Wild by Robert Kaufman, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a black fabric and a white fabric.

We will be selling fat quarters of the focus fabric at the meetings for \$2 each. It should only take one fat quarter to make the twelve blocks for this year.

We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep.

Cut list -- For one block:

Focus fabric: one 2½" X 5½" rectangle

Coordinating fabric: four 4½" squares White fabric: four 4½" squares

Black fabric: one 4½" square, three 2½" X 5½" rectangles


Assembling the block:

- · Use the photos to get the color placement.
- After cutting your coordinating fabric (mine is orange), fold one block in half. Stack all blocks together right sides up with the square with the fold marks on top. Refer to pictures 2 and 3. Use a ruler with a ¼" line or just eyeball it and line up the ruler so the cutting edge is ¼" away from the fold mark on one side and ¼' away from the bottom corner.
- Cut this corner off. Look at picture 3. This should give you the same angle for each of your star points.
- Sew the feature fabric and black rectangles to the trimmed color squares. See picture 4 (photo is zoomed in): line up the long edge of 2 ½" X 5 ½" rectangle along the cut you made in the last step. Just have the tip of the rectangle (1/4") hang over the top edge. Press toward the color fabric.
- Trim these squares to 4 ½" square as in picture 5.
- Layout pieces in correct order as shown in photo one.
- Using a precise 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the horizontal rows together. Alternate pressing of seams to allow the to nest against each other in the next step.
- Keep rows in order and now sew rows together. If pressed correctly, the seams should nest and help patches aligned.
- Press seams and square the block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Repeat to make a second block to keep!



May	Art Supplies: Colored Pencils, crayons, coloring books, children's scissors, colored paper; beading supplies; card making supplies.
June	Office supplies: copy paper, Printer Ink HP 8720 and 8600, tape, pens and pencils.
July	Body wash, hand soap, bar soap, shampoo, conditioner, toilet paper, paper towels.

We have had a few new ladies join us on Saturday workdays, and that helped us prepare kits, add borders to increase quilt size, and cut batting/backing. We welcome any who want to come. They do not need to be members of the Guild if you have a friend who would like to join you, and we are also able to sign off on school volunteer hours.



PATT BLAIR'S WORKSHOP



Can you believe this little quilt top is created using fabric, napkin and Kleenex tissues, stamps ,stencils, marking pens and pencils? You will design your own whimsical version of what you chose to adhere to fabric. All will be beautiful. I will bring several types of napkins, tissues, and stamps for you to play with but I encourage you bring something you love too. You'll chose items, lay them around on your fabric piece 'til you are 'happy', then adhere them to your art quilt top with my instruction.

PATT'S KIT includes the items on the SUPPLY LIST and **is available for \$15**. The workshop is on Wednesday, April 11, from 10am to 4pm at the Glen Oaks Hills Community Club House, 40101 De Portola, Temecula, CA 92592.

Student Supply List

- a. A smooth surface white trash bag-like kitchen size 13 gal. to protect work table
- b. A few paper towels for clean up hand wipe
- c. Small amount of painters or masking tape
- d. Plastic throwaway plate (any size, white is best)
- e. A black Pigma Pen (I like smaller point ones but bring what you own)
- f. Appx. ¼ yard freezer paper to use as a stencil and/or palette
- g. Small Paper scissors
- h. Stencil brush
- i. A zip loc type bag or equivalent to protect and transport your finished piece home.
- k. a small throwaway magazine to be used as a glue application surface.

DESIRABLE: Things you already own

- 1. A printed napkin or 2 you might love, a couple interesting stamps you already own, stamp pad, even interesting tissue paper, newspaper images (I'll be bringing some).
- 2. Any stencil or rubber stamp you want to play with
- 3. If you have one with you, a few shareable classroom hair dryers will be helpful.
- 4. 1 or 2 Shiva paint sticks (the metallic and neutral tones work well for this) .4.
- 5. A few choice Prismacolor pencils you already own. I'll bring some.
- 6. A Brayer if you already own one. (Brayers will roll added images flat).
- 7. A flat paint brush (approx 1/2" to 3/4" wide)
- 8. A used tea bag, dried, cut open and emptied..i.e. just the tea bag tissue

- Prepared fabric piece
- Matte Medium
- Choice of assorted stamped tissues, napkins, papers
- Class instructions.
- A collection of Misc. media supplies for use in class.




