I learned an awful lot from her lecture—especially her organizational method of strips 1-1/2", 2", 2-1/2" and 3" wide. I attended the workshop too, and that was fun. I only got one full block completed (but lots of other parts done). Now, to find the time to complete it!

I hope you each had a chance to go to **Road to California** if you wanted to go and see the many beautiful and amazing quilts! So many vendors! I bought a new machine tote for my Featherweight. Very chic! The most amazing thing was that my feet weren't absolutely killing me by the time I left.

## **Block of the Month**

#### Block of The Month 2018: Block #2

Is everyone ready for block #2? We are keeping with nine patch variations and this is just like a basic nine patch, but the units are different sizes. This block makes some wonderful secondary patterns when four or more blocks are put together.

The fabrics you need this month are our focus fabric -- Effervescence – Wild by Robert Kaufman, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a black fabric and a white fabric.

We will be selling fat quarters of the focus fabric at the meetings for \$2 each. It should only take one fat quarter to make the twelve blocks for this year.

We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep.

#### Cut list -- For one block:

From focus: one 2 1/2" square

From coordinating fabric: one 6 1/2" square, one 4 1/2" square

From black fabric: two 2 1/2" by 6 1/2" rectangles

From white fabric: two 4 1/2" by 6 1/2" rectangles, two 4 1/2" by

2 1/2" rectangles

#### Assembling the block:

- Use the photos to get the color placement.
- Layout pieces in correct order as shown in photo two.
- Using a precise 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the horizontal rows together, pressing away from your white fabric.
- Keep rows in order and now sew rows together. If pressed correctly, the seams should nest and help patches aligned.
- Press seams and square the block to 12 1/2" x 12
  1/2". Repeat to make a second block to keep! Here is a
  photo of a finished block.
  When making a quilt out of this block, try rotating the
  blocks in different ways to find the arrangement you like
  best.

## 2018 Email Usage

Hi Everyone,

We are off to a new year and with all the new members it's a good time to revisit the use of the Guild's email accounts.

There are certain conditions that apply for all the lists:

- **1. Please send only guild related business to our email accounts.** Please do not use the emails as means to advertise, sell, or for anything that is not guild business related.
- 2. You must be a member of a list in order to send an email to that list. Membership in a list is the email address that you registered with the guild.
- 3. You may not necessarily receive a copy of the email you send to a list because the program we use now recognizes the sender's email. I suggest you copy yourself on the email. You can always check with me to see if the email did go through.
- 4. Changes to email accounts, new member emails, etc, all need to go through Membership.
- 5. If you do not use the guild's email address exactly as it shows below, the email will not go through. Contact Cheri McDowell at <a href="mailto:mcdowell22@verizon.net">mcdowell22@verizon.net</a> for help.

Here are the four email lists for our Guild:

<u>guildmembers@valleyofthemistquilters.com</u> - this goes to all members who have an email listed with the guild and it is for general guild business.

<u>newsletters@valleyofthemistquilters.com</u> - all members receive the email and it is generally reserved for newsletters and news related emails.

<u>boardmembers@valleyofthemistquilters.com</u> – list is restricted to board members use only

<u>presidentsquilt@valleyofthemistquilters.com</u> – a means to correspond with guild members any information regarding the president's quilt, without the president receiving it.

We don't want to give away any details before she receives her quilt! If you ever have issues, please contact me or membership. I prefer to be contacted by email as it's the easiest way to verify your email address. As soon as we know there is an issue, we can address it and correct it.



## **Philanthropy**

#### News for February 2018

We received a wonderful thank you letter from the Alternatives to Domestic Violence (ADV) center for the quilts and pillowcases, and for some additional art supplies that a few of us donated. The children and mothers loved the new colors and designs they added to their beds, and enjoyed making beaded bracelets, necklaces and gift cards for each other.

Since the Veteran's Program had indicated they no longer needed hygiene and other types of supplies on a monthly basis, the Board and the Philanthropy team have decided to continue this type of program with the ADV Center. We will list a monthly selection of items as a suggestion so that people can choose from what is convenient or perhaps something you may have in stock. We will be delivering these items to them on a monthly basis rather than waiting until once per year. Here is the list of the categories of monthly items they indicated a need for thru July, and then we will re-evaluate based on response:

February	Sewing supplies - everything
March	\$10.00 (+) gift cards to Winco, Stater Bros., Vons Target, Walmart or any gas company or VISA type card that can be used anywhere.
April	Cleaning supplies: Bleach, all purpose cleaner, lysol, toilet bowl cleaner, glass cleaner, sponges.
Мау	Art Supplies: Colored Pencils, crayons, coloring books, children's scissors, colored paper; beading supplies; card making supplies.
June	Office supplies: copy paper, Printer Ink HP 8720 and 8600, tape, pens and pencils.
July	Body wash, hand soap, bar soap, shampoo, conditioner, toilet paper, paper towels.

#### Please drop off items at the Philanthropy table.

They also indicated the need for larger ticket items we did not feel appropriate to put in the above small item list. Perhaps you have some of these <u>very gently</u> used items sitting around, or a Friendship group may decide to contribute as a group to purchase new items. Items include: A sewing machine, vacuum cleaners, pots and pans, and twin bed sheet sets. Please let Karen Wurfel know if you have any of these items, and we can put them directly in her car so you do not have to carry them in.
