She created more than 70 patterns for dolls and stuffed animals with a country primitive feel. Many of her designs were licensed through the Butterick Pattern Company, translated into 7 languages and sold around the globe through fabric stores.

Quilting has always been Bonnie's first love. She has been machine quilting since 1989 and professionally long arm quilting for the public since 1995, retiring in 2009, when she no longer had the time due to her teaching, traveling and writing schedule. She has been featured in magazines both for her quilt patterns and articles

she has written on scrap management and using that stash to its full potential. Wow, we could all use that information!

Bonnie enjoys meeting with quilters, teaching workshops and lecturing to quilt guilds all over the world, challenging quilters to break the rules, think outside the box, and find what brings them joy. 

One shows the quilt in a different color-way, The other is in the color-way per the yardage and cutting instructions. Philanthropy

Tour of the Alternatives to Domestic Violence Shelter.

After coming onto the property through a key code gate, we entered the home and saw a large common area room with well-worn furniture around the perimeter and another smaller grouping around a single television. All common living is done in this area or in the outside areas. There is playground equipment for the children.

The laundry area is well equipped. We turned and walked down the hallway to the individual family bedrooms. Bedrooms can have a maximum of three sets of bunk beds, with up to 8-10 members of a family in a single bedroom. A Jack and Jill bathroom connects two bedroom units. As you can imagine, there is not much privacy.

There is a lovely preschool room set up for those women who need to leave their children for work on a regular basis. It is well furnished and very inviting. The children may attend part and full day programs. Women are assisted with accessing/enrolling in programs for which they are eligible including vocational, educational, medical, SSI, local gas/bus assistance programs and with help in looking for transitional housing.

There is a large kitchen. Since the families are from many different nationalities and cultures, and due to varied family schedules and dietary needs, each family unit purchases and prepares their own food, preps and cleans up, and has a table assigned to them. That means many women tend to be in the kitchen cooking near the same time, but the staff indicated that it goes fairly smoothly. The one issue is that there are never enough pots and pans. To accommodate, one mother arises early and prepares all her meals at one time, while another mother may make all of her meals at night.


There are few women with cars, so many women will caravan together to shop for food and other sundries. When available, the center provides gas and grocery cards. The clients try and help support each other with gas money if possible. The transit authority provides some bus passes, but the service in the area of the shelter is poor and stops running early in the evening.

At this time, there is no dedicated activity room for sewing or arts and crafts activities, but they are working on it. They do not have a machine for routine repairs. If they had the equipment and materials, some women have indicated an interest in clothing construction .

Throughout the tour, I was amazed at how much they do with so little. They do not have large corporate funding streams, and the facility impressed me with how humble it is.

Since the shelter presentation, several Guild members have come up to Ida and me to ask how else they can help. I have spoken with our President, Ellen, and we have agreed that we will discuss this more after the first of the year, but in the meantime, we are going to try and get a sewing area put together for this facility. Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2018: Block #1

Hope you are ready for another year of block of the month. I talked at the November meeting and showed everyone there the focus fabric we will be using every month. The fabric we chose is Effervescence – Wild by Robert Kaufman. The color scheme for 2018 is going to be the focus fabric (only a small piece), a fabric you choose based on the colors in the focus fabric, black and /or white depending on how many colors are needed in the block. All blocks will be a nine patch or nine patch variation. This photo shows the focus fabric with some possible coordinating fabrics around it.

We will be selling fat quarters of the focus fabric at the meetings for \$2 each. It should only take one fat quarter to make the twelve blocks for this year.

Our first block of the year is a basic nine patch. Use the photos to get the color placement. We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep.



From focus: one 4 1/2" square

From black and your coordinating fabric: four 4 1/2" squares

Assembling the block:

- Layout pieces in correct order as shown in photo.
- Using a precise 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the horizontal rows together, pressing toward the black fabric.
- · Keep rows in order and now sew rows together. If pressed

correctly, the seams should nest and help patches aligned.

• Press seams and square the block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Repeat to make a second block to keep! Here are photos of our finished blocks. Look at the difference depending on if you pick a dark or light coordinating fabric.

Have fun – we won't go so easy on you next month.






