Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2018: Block #6

Block number four is called Criss-Cross. This block is due at the September meeting. We are keeping with nine patch variations and this is a simple one where you make four corner blocks –two of each color version and then add in the other pieces.

The fabrics you need this month are our focus fabric -Effervescence – Wild by Robert Kaufman, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a black fabric and a white fabric.

We will be selling fat quarters of the focus fabric at the meetings for \$2 each. It should only take one fat quarter to make the twelve blocks for this year.

We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep.

Cut list -- For one block:

Focus fabric: two 2" squares

Coordinating color fabric: four 3½" X 5" rectangles,

two 2" squares

Black fabric: five 3 ½" squares


White fabric: eight 2" X 3½" rectangles

Assembling the block:

- Use the photos to get the color placement and watch this carefully when assembling.
- To assemble the corner squares: Sew a white rectangle to one focus fabric square. Press toward focus fabric. Repeat. Now do the same with a white rectangle and a coordinating fabric square, repeat to get two.
- Sew a black square to one of the remaining white rectangles and repeat three times. Press to the black.
- Now sew one of the pieces from the first step to one of the pieces from the second step, putting the white next to the black and matching seams. Press toward black.
- Layout pieces in correct order as shown in photo three.
- Using a precise 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the horizontal rows together, pressing pieces with a horizontal seam toward the other piece.
- Keep rows in order and now sew rows together. If pressed correctly, the seams should nest and help patches aligned.
- Press seams and square the block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".
 Repeat to make a second block to keep!

OLD TOWN OUTDOOR QUILT SHOW 2018

UPDATE:

The Quilt Show is coming up faster than you think! It will take place in Old Town Temecula on **Saturday, October 6, from 10 am to 4 pm**. It is open to Guild members only for quilt submissions, although anyone may attend, of course.

We really need all of you to help in one form or another. Here are some areas we would especially love to have your help on:

- Plan to hang several of your beautiful quilts in the show. They do not need to be "expert" quilts. We truly do want you to hang YOUR quilts!
- Make one or more quilts to sell in the auction (we need 50-75 quilts to sell). Remember, you can get up to 50% of the auction sales price back on any or all quilts you put into the auction!! YOU can set the minimum bid amount, which means that if bidding fails to come up to your minimum, we don't sell the quilt. You get it back, no harm, no foul. This money can really add up—just ask Mary Ruth Wilson!
- Post info about the quilt show and the live streamed auction on your Facebook page. Live streaming means people from far away, such as YOUR FRIENDS AND RELATIVES can bid on and buy your quilts!
- We need a photographer or videographer—someone, or more than one person, to take a
 whole lot of photos (and if possible, video) of the quilt show. Please see Rita Dominguez
 or Janice Quackenbush.

The live auction will sell large throw quilts (slightly smaller than twin size) up to king size quilts. Smaller sized throws and crib quilts will be sold outright at our vendor booth. **YOU** set the price, and **you** can receive up to 50% of the sales price back. The Silent Auction will include wall hangings, table runners, and totes.

# **Workshop Survey Results: May 2018**

Fifty-two responses to the workshop survey distributed Tuesday night at our May meeting were received, and the results were enlightening. Our membership appears to be equally interested in traditional quilting and the Modern Movement (27-25). After interest shown in the Specialty Block and Specialty Patchwork Quilt categories, the technique most frequently requested, (with a score of 1.75 on a scale of 1-5 with 5 the lowest) was free-motion quilting, with hand quilting a distant second. You will be pleased to learn that Jill Schumacher, coming this year in October, is here to teach us just that. Also, in February of 2020, we will be entertained by **Sharon Schamber**, a renowned free-motion quilter. Sharon offers many different levels of free-motion classes for your domestic machine, so I urge you to check out her website and indicate to me the one in which you are most interested.

The second most requested technique was Applique (2.63), with Freezer Paper, Fusible, and Reverse techniques most frequently requested, in that order. Perhaps we can encourage one or more of our members to demonstrate techniques at our Quilter's University held at our July meeting. Threadwork was the next most popular category (3.46) with Embellishment and Redwork neck-in-neck, and Sashiko and Thread Painting a close second. Then came Fabric dying and painting scoring equally under the Fabric Manipulation category (3.58), with Landscape a very close second, followed by Portraiture and Trapunto. You will be pleased to learn that in January of 2019 we will have **Linda Schmidt** who will teach us a Landscape including thread painting technique, and in February we will have **Tamera Leberer** in a two-day workshop teaching us silk fusion.

Under the Piecing category, English paper piecing, standard paper piecing, and Foundation piecing were pretty much even across the board. Can we have a volunteer demonstrate English paper piecing at Quilters University? Next year we will have **Sue Rasmussen** teaching us curved flying geese using a paper piecing technique. Those of you interested in learning foundation piecing, I highly recommend coming to our philanthropy sew-in the last Saturday of every month at the Assistance League and **Georgianne's** free Quilt-as-you-Go class held on Saturday, June 23rd at the Glen Oaks Clubhouse.

Many respondents also indicated interest in smaller projects including coasters, bowls, purses, and wallets. In April of next year, **Alyson Allen** will teach us a rope method for making a carry-all.

Otherwise, be on the lookout for a teacher you would like to recommend to teach us a Bargello quilt (great You Tube videos online) Hidden Nine-Patch (Ellen?), and Dresden Plate, Hawaiian, and Crazy quilting for 2020. We need to get a Grandmother's Garden and Dear Jane Friendship Group going - anyone wanting to sign on?


