"Finding Your Passion and Running With It" Come and ignite your quilting passion—more than ever.

And Saturday from 10am - 4pm for the Workshop

Jean says, The Spider Web design is an old quilt block sometimes called a String Quilt. I have fallen in love with this design and have continued to make it again and again, each time making it a bit differently. In this class, anything goes and everyone is successful.

It's a bit of old-style quilting, mixing it up with the fascinating use of color and design and making it your own. We will start sewing almost immediately and I will be able to teach you techniques for accuracy and speed. Weave strips of fabric into a new quilt full of surprises. You will loose yourself into the rhythm of stitches and repetition while making a work of art.

Bring your favorite fabrics and scraps whether it's contemporary, modern, traditional, hand dyes, tonal, batiks, or thimbleberries - it looks best when you throw in everything.... My first Spider Web had over 280 different fabrics – not including the crazy pieced kites. It was so exciting that I have made more than a dozen more.

In my one day class, you will have enough time to make a pillow, and then if you love the process, you can continue on and make the whole quilt. It's fun, it's creative, and you'll learn techniques that you will continue to use on other quilts you make. There is a \$12.00 Kit Fee which includes your own kite-shaped Plexiglass Template.

Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2018: Block #3

Here is block #3. This block is due at the April meeting. We are keeping with nine patch variations and this is a simple variation with each of the nine patches made with two-- 21/2" X 41/2" pieces of fabric.

The fabrics you need this month are our focus fabric -- Effervescence – Wild by Robert Kaufman, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a black fabric and a white fabric.

We will be selling fat quarters of the focus fabric at the meetings for \$2 each. It should only take one fat quarter to make the twelve blocks for this year.

We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep.

Cut list -- For one block:

Focus fabric: one 21/2" X 41/2" rectangle Coordinating color fabric: two 21/2" X 18" strips, one 21/2" X 41/2" rectangle

Assembling the block:

- Use the photos to get the color placement.
- Sew white strip to one color strip. Press toward color.
 Cut into four 41/2"strips.
- Sew black strip to remaining color strip. Press toward black. Cut into four 41/2"strips.
- Sew the feature fabric rectangle to the remaining color rectangle –sewing on the long edge. Press open.
- Layout pieces in correct order as shown in photo three.
- Using a precise 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the horizontal rows together, pressing pieces with a horizontal seam toward the other piece.
- Keep rows in order and now sew rows together. If pressed correctly, the seams should nest and help patches aligned.
- Press seams and square the block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".
 Repeat to make a second block to keep!






