Reminders

Our August guild-meeting program is the annual Philanthropy Sewing Bee. This year we will focus on two major projects:

- 1) **Mile-A-Minute** guilt tops for the US Vets Program or the Alternatives to Domestic Violence Shelter.
- Christmas stockings for the at-risk youth in the Sheriff's SAFE 2) program.

Check in at the membership table and signup for one of the teams described below. We need sewers, ironers, and cutters. Check into your station and set up your machine or cutting equipment. Following a very brief business meeting, we will have great fun with assembly line construction. We hope to finish several quilt tops that night and move towards our goal of 75 Christmas stockings. Guest fees are waived for this evening so bring a friend who would like to help.

Sewing Teams: Bring your sewing machine and all supplies. We suggest you use a grey or other neutral thread and prewind 3-4 bobbins.

- Mile-A-Minute Team The technique is a fun, easy, "you can't make a mistake," kind of technique to use up scraps. Demonstration will be available to show you how to make the 6 1/2" blocks. A scrap bin will be provided or bring your own.
- **Block Assembly Team** You will be sewing the 6 ½" blocks together to form the quilt top. Sashing strips will be available.
- **Christmas Stocking Team** Kits will be ready for assembly. We are going to use ribbon or decorative cording for the hang-up loops this year. We have some cording that will be available but feel free to bring some if you have extra.

Block Trimming Team: Bring a small mat, your favorite rotary cutter and a 6 ½" square if you have one.

You will be trimming the blocks to 6 ½" square.

Ironing Team: No supplies needed:

This can be a sitting job. You will be ironing joined pieces, and finished

Hand Sewing Team: Please bring your favorite needles, binding clips, small scissors. To complete the last step of the guilts, you will be hand sewing on binding and labels. (Trimming and machine stitching of binding will have been done).

President's Message



Well it's August, and it's pretty dang hot. I hope you're finding time to cut and sew and finish. I've been working on the 2019 Opportunity Quilt with my pal Lynn Korito. Of 221 blocks, we have finished 135. All 110 of the double 9-patches are done, and 25 of the 111 shoo-fly blocks are done. It's kind of a slog, but we're having fun! I also have a bunch of vets' quilts kind of done — 4 sets of blocks sewn together, but they still need borders. I need to set aside a day to just do that and get them to a quilter.

I am very excited that August is here, because August is **Philanthropy Sew-In night** for guild! We are going to make a boatload of Mile-A-Minute blocks, and it's going to be a blast. Philanthropy will provide fabric, but I would encourage you all to bring your own scraps to mix in. Mile-A-Minute takes scrap STRIPS and scrap WHATEVERS. Doesn't matter how wide or narrow the

strips are or how big or small the whatevers are. Just bring them! We will sew them all up and by the end of the evening you're going to be thrilled, THRILLED, I tell you, that you have learned this clever new way to use up your scraps. Of course, your scraps will never actually get used up, because they reproduce in the dark. But still, you're going to be glad you learned how to do Mile-A-Minute.


I myself learned how to do Mile-A-Minute at an August Philanthropy Sew-In, a few years back. Even though I'm the one who wrote down the instructions for how to do it, I did not create it. I don't really know who did. But it's cool and it's fun.

Bring your scraps to contribute if you want, we're happy to get them and use them, whether you are planning to be a sewer or not. If you're planning to sew, bring your machine and thread—any neutral color will do. Bring your usual sewing stuff—scissors or snippers, whatever you need. Your Ott light, bring it. If you're planning to be a presser, just show up. We have irons and ironing boards. But if you'd like to bring an iron and a pressing set-up, that's fine! If you're planning to be a trimmer, we'll have cutting mats there, but feel free to bring your own medium size cutting mat, rotary cutter, and a 6-1/2" (OR LARGER SQUARE) ruler. It will all make sense when you get here and see what the dealio is.

This is possibly my favorite month of the year, because we all get to work on philanthropy. I think philanthropy is the best work we do. And hey, if you're a quilter new to the guild, and/or you're a beginner kind of quilter, you might find yourself bonding and blending into the workings of the guild best by attending the philanthropy Saturdays. These are the last Saturday of the month, held at the Assistance League on Montezuma (Temecula). We'd sure love to have you come and help, and get to know you in the process!

Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2018: Block #8

This block is a loose variation on the Ohio Star block. These blocks are due at the September meeting. We are keeping with nine patch variations – have fun.

The fabrics you need this month are our focus fabric -Effervescence – Wild by Robert Kaufman, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a black fabric and a white fabric.

We will be selling fat quarters of the focus fabric at the meetings for \$2 each. It should only take one fat quarter to make two of all the twelve blocks for this year.

We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep.

Cut list -- For one block:

Focus fabric: two 2½" squares Coordinating-color fabric: two 4 7/8" squares

(Sub-cut both of these squares diagonally once to end up with 4 triangles)

two 21/2" squares

Black: four 2 7/8" squares

one 5 1/4" square

White: four 2 7/8" squares

one 4 ½" square one 5 ¼" square

Sub-cut both the white & the black 51/4" squares through both diagonals to get 4 triangles of each color

Assembling the block:

- Use the photos for color placement and assembly help.
- To create the star points use the triangles sub-cut so far:
 - 1. Using one white and one black triangle piece, place them right sides together and sew a ¼' seam. Check the seam you are sewing to make sure the black will be on the correct side when you are done and that the correct edge is being sewn. It is easier to sew if you place the flat edge against the needle and sew to the point. See photo two. Press to the black fabric. Make four of these units.
 - 2. Now place a color triangle piece on the white/black unit, right sides together. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on the long edge. Make four. Press to the color.
- To create the corner units:
 - 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all four of the white 2 7/8" squares. Place each of the white squares on one of the black 2 7/8" squares, right sides together. Sew 1/4" from either side of the drawn diagonal line, cut in two on the drawn diagonal line. Press toward the black fabric. You should have eight 21/2" half square triangles.
 - 2. Assemble the corner four-patches using 2 half-square triangles, one white 2½" square & one focus fabric 2½" square for two of the corners and one coordinating fabric 2½" square for the other two corners. Look at photo one for reference.





Block of the Month, con't.

Now the final assembly! Layout pieces in correct order as shown in photo one.

- Using a precise 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the horizontal rows together, alternate the pressing of the middle row with the top and bottom rows so the seams will nest in the next step.
- Keep rows in order and now sew rows together. The seams should nest and help keep patches aligned.
- Press seams and square the block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Repeat to make a second block to keep!


Good luck and remember we are expecting you to turn in all your summer blocks at the September meeting.


