


Congratulations Maryruth Wilson. You are the best and deserve every good thing including recognition.

Block of the Month

Round Robin Mystery 2021: Month #1

Welcome to the 2021 Valley of the Mist Round Robin Mystery! This project is designed to get you sewing your own round robin – but it is a mystery because you get the next round instructions each month. If you have a group of friends that want to exchange projects like a traditional round robin – go for it, but that isn't required. We will have seven rounds (months) and in month eight, we give you time to quilt and bind your creation. Finished quilts will be displayed at the September meeting and also displayed at the 2021 Outdoor Quilt Show.

The round robin is being designed in conjunction with 2021 Block of the Month. You will need to reference the block of the month instructions in January, March, May, and July to get the full instructions in those months. These blocks are all designed using four fabrics. For the round robin, you can choose fabrics as you want, and interpret the instructions as you want, but we suggest you follow the sizes used in block of the month or you will have to



do the calculations. The final size of the quilt after the 7th month will be 78.5" X 88.5". We understand that not everyone wants a quilt this size, so if you are working on this quilt by yourself, you can adjust the size, but please use the same proportion each month. We think it might be fun to see a half size quilt, but that is up to you. So, here are your instructions for month #1.

Make a block as described in the January 2021 Block of the Month. This should give you a block 12.5" square.

For new quilters that have never done a round robin, we thought we would explain a traditional round robin. The idea is that you have a group of quilters that work on each other's quilts. Each quilter puts together a project box of fabrics and notes about their quilt. They make the first-round block and then after that, each round the quilt is passed to another quilter in the group. Each quilter does each round, but the quilts move to a new person each month. It challenges quilters to do their best to interpret the instructions as they think the owner of the quilt would like. The owner is the person who makes the first block. Sometimes you will need to add fabric or embellishments to complete the round. This round robin can be done in this method, but it is not required.

Let's have a wonderful quilting year! By the way we do have a YouTube video each month with the instructions.

Philanthropy

PHILANTHROPY FINISHES 2020 ON A HIGH NOTE

Although 2020 has presented huge challenges for all of us in many ways, it seems fairly remarkable that the guild's philanthropy program has managed to continue to chug along without meeting since February. In the course of the final 9 months of the year, we have cleaned out and organized the guild's storage unit, cut and prepped a boatload of pillowcase kits, cut and prepped a bunch of quilt kits, collected fabric and goods donations, delivered and picked up pillowcases, quilts, and stockings, and continued to coax, remind, and beg the membership via the newsletter and email blasts that now is a good time to sew for others. Our sincere thanks to all who responded to our pleas! Outreach efforts by Lynn Korito brought us into contact with Lisa Roybal, who heads up the women's program of the Loma Linda VA. Finally, a way to help female veterans as well!

Over the course of 2020, Valley of the Mist Quilters philanthropy program has donated 266 quilts, 421 pillowcases, 345 face masks, 19 totes, and 9 Christmas stockings. Our quilt and pillowcase numbers beat those of 2019! In addition to these items, we also delivered the following to US Vets at March ARB and the Alternatives to Domestic Violence shelter: kitchenware, cookware, dinnerware, toiletries, sheet sets, towels, pillows, two new inflatable twin-size mattresses, a standing fan, shower curtains and hooks, glassware, and fabric. (Fabric was donated to our contact Lisa Roybal who took it to female inmates at the women's facility at Chino for their sewing program.)

Lynn Korito made 25 deliveries. Recipients included US Vets at March ARB, female inmates at the women's facility at Chino, the Women's Vet Program through the Loma Linda VA, women and children housed at our local shelter, Alternatives to Domestic Violence, and local foster children aided by the good people at the Temecula Assistance League.

We continue to collect baby quilts for the coming Mother's Day Baby Shower for veteran mothers in need. So far we have around 25 quilts. There are no specific size requirements for these baby quilts—just that they be baby quilts, in baby colors and type.

We remain willing to receive your donations for these sources. Just give one of us a text or call and we will arrange for pickup.
