# 2021 Quilt Display In the Rotunda At the Grace Mellman Library 

September 4, 2021 through October 1, 2021
Artist Guidelines
If you are interested in having one of your quilts on display at the library this year, this is what we are looking for:

- Quilts no smaller than $16^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ and no larger than $20^{\prime \prime} \times 30^{\prime \prime}$. We need 9 quilts -7 for the rotunda and 2 for managers' offices.
- Hanging: Quilts must have a back panel/casing at top of quilt. It is best if the panel/casing is split with an opening in middle of the quilt. The quilt must hang straight off 1 hook on the wall; hooks cannot be changed.
- Digital photo of your quilt (email to pdmcgaugh@hotmail.com) along with the Quilt Biography. Paula will be happy to photograph your quilt. The Quilt Biography form is attached, or call Paula and she can complete this form for you. Info due to Paula by 08/01/2021 as it is due to the library prior to 08/04/2021.
- Quilt Biography: quilt's name, owner's name, what was your inspiration, pattern info, medium, hand or machine pieced by whom, hand or machine quilted by whom, size, the dollar value (whether it is for sale or not), and is it for sale or not. See attached form (email to pdmcgaugh@hotmail.com) or call Paula and she will complete for you.
- Quilts due to Paula by 09/01/2021. Paula will pick up or you can give them to her at August meeting if we have one.

## Block of the Month

## Block of The Month 2021: Block \#7

Our block this month is an improv 4-point star. You get to decide the fabric placement, we just want you to use at least one piece of each fabric in your block. The photo of the block shows each piece as the same fabric, but you can mix it up. For example, piece \#1 can be a different fabric in each sub-block.
To get started, here are the fabrics you need: your focus fabric, a coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, and two neutral color fabrics. Pick ones that contrast with each other. (Neutral colors include black, brown, grey, white, and shades or hues of these.) Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.)
Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.


Cut list -- For one block - remember you decide fabric placement but use at least on piece of each fabric in the block. Refer to photo 2 for piece diagram.
Piece 1 (star center): Four $3^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5$ " strips
Pieces 2, 3 \& 4: Eight of each piece. The average width of these pieces should be 2.75 ". The lengths needed are: piece \#2 -- 6"; piece \#3-4.5", piece \#4 -- 3". When laying next to each other, before sewing, the total width of the three pieces should be at least 8.25".

## Assembling the block: Use a quarter inch seam

- To make the center diamond pieces: press each piece 1 rectangle in half so you end up with folded $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Using a square ruler with a center diagonal line up with folded $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Using a square ruler with a center diagonal line
or $45^{\circ}$ guide, line up the guideline to cut off a $45^{\circ}$ corner. See photo 3 . Now line up a ruler to the lower point of the just cut off corner and the bottom fold of the rectangle.
See photo 4 , cut along the ruler, cutting off these bottom triangles to end up with the ruler to the lower point of the just cut off corner and the bottom fold of the rectangle.
See photo 4 , cut along the ruler, cutting off these bottom triangles to end up with the diamond shown in photo 5 .
- Now, prep a ruler to use as a reference for creating each of the four triangles that
 make up the block. If you have a 9.5 " square up ruler, then you are set - the triangles that make up the block are the same size as half this ruler - you will either use the diagonal line marked on the ruler or make a diagonal mark with blue painter's tape marking a line between two opposite corners. If you don't have this size ruler, use your 12.5 " square up ruler and place blue painter's tape 2.25 " above the center diagonal. This will make a same size triangle to use as a guide.
- Refer to the photo 2 diagram. We need to make these four triangle pieces shown. Start with one of your diamond pieces (piece \#1) and one piece \#2. It can be placed on either side of the diamond but note which side you start with and do the same for each triangle if you want them to look symmetrical. You are sewing the piece \#2 to one of the long sides of the diamond. Start at the edge that connects to one of the short sides. These corners are less pointy and easier to sew to. Place the corner of piece \#2 about $1 / 4 "$ past the corner of piece \#1. You will need to do this whenever adding a piece to the triangles we are sewing. Sew the two together along a long side. Press the seam. It doesn't matter which way you press it, but all seams will be pressed the same direction. After this first seam, trim off the extra at the bottom that will get in the way of the next seam. See photo 6 . Now sew on the other piece \#2 on the other side of the diamond and press. After sewing on each piece, use a ruler aligned with the short side of the diamond to mark the edge of the triangle we are forming. See photo 7 . Each piece added should be aligned $1 / 4$ "above this line as shown in photos 8 and 9.
- Continue adding pieces $3 \& 4$ to the triangle in order. After the piece \#4's are added the triangle should be a big as the area marked on half the $9.5^{\prime \prime}$ ruler or the 12.5 " ruler marked with painter's tape. Use the ruler to trim off the excess corners/fabric on the inner sides of the triangles as shown in photo 10. Don't trim the edge that will form the outside of the final block just yet. Now make three more of these triangles.
- Now arrange the triangles as in photo 2. Sew together each pair of neighboring triangles. Press the seams in opposite directions. Nest the center seams and sew the final center seam. Press.
- Now to square it up. Use your $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12 \frac{1}{2}$ " square up ruler, place it over the block. Make sure there is fabric under all parts of the ruler and trim to $12 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. You can make it wonky or not, it is your decision what you like best.

We hope you enjoy this block - see you next month.

## Round Robin Mystery 2021: Month \#7

Everyone that is participating in the Round Robin this year - please email me at adrianeridder@gmail.com to let me know you will have a quilt to display with the Round Robin quilts at our quilt show in October. I need to reserve space for these quilts. Please give me the approximate dimensions of your finished quilt just make your best guess. The size after you add this month's border should be your finished size.

Instructions to date:
Month \#1: Make a block as described in the January 2021 Block of the Month.
Month \#2: Add fabric to only two sides of your round \#1 block to make the block
 16.75 " square. This round must also incorporate something from nature, be creative or be minimal, it is up to you.
Month \#3: Make two blocks following the instructions for the March 2021 Block of the Month. Cut these blocks in two diagonally so you have four triangles. Add the triangles to the four sides of your round robin block from February. This should give you a block approximately 24 " square.

Month \#4: Add a border to no more than two sides of your block. Incorporate triangles into this border in some manner. The final size of you quilt at the end of this round is approximately 24 " X 34 ".
Month \#5: Make the Block of the Month block for May 2021. This is a 4-square block - don't sew the four squares together. Use these four squares as cornerstones in the $6.5 "$ border you add this month. The size of you quilt at the end of this round is approximately 36 " $\times 46$ ".
Month \#6: Add a 10" border to all four sides. Incorporate curves in this border. The size of you quilt at the end of this round is approximately $55^{\prime \prime} \times 65$ ".
New instructions: Make at least two blocks following the instructions for the July 2021 Block of the Month. Incorporate these in the 12.5 " border you are adding to all four sides. The size of you quilt at the end of this round is approximately $79{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 89$ ".

If you are having trouble visualizing, we are doing a YouTube video each month where we are showing how we are implementing the instructions - but you can certainly do it differently.
