## Block of the Month

## Block of The Month 2021: Block \#6

Our block this month is an improv version of the Hourglass Block. This is another four-patch block, so each sub-block is 6.5 ". It is a fun block to make, but fabric placement needs to be watched to get the right look.
To get started, here are the fabrics you need: your focus fabric, a coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, and two neutral color fabrics. Pick ones that contrast with each other. (Neutral colors include black, brown, grey, white, and shades or hues of these.) Remember, all our blocks end up 12.5" X 12.5" (a 12" finished block.)
Also, the Guild's website and Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.


Cut list -- For one block - you decide fabric placement
Fabric 1 (side handles): Eight $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 8$ " strips
Fabric 2 \& 3 (sand \& air above sand): Two 6 " squares of each
Fabric 4 (background): Four 4" squares
Assembling the block: Use a quarter inch seam

- To make the side handle pieces: press fabric 4 squares on one diagonal and then cut them on the other diagonal. See photo 2.

If using a long strip of fabric for fabric 1 - then press as follows: press a mark across the $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ width at 4 " and then every 8 " along the length of the strips. If using 8 " pieces for fabric 1 , press to mark the center of each strip.
Center the press mark on fabric 4 to the pressed mark on fabric 1 strips and sew fabric 1 to the hypotenuse (long edge) of the fabric 4 triangles. Press to the darker fabric and then use a ruler to trim the extra off as shown in photo 3.

- To make the sand and air pieces: stack fabrics 2 and 3 in pairs - one of each
 fabric, both fabrics facing up. For each pair, press one diagonal and then cut on the other. You should now have four triangle pairs, keep them stacked facing up, one of each color. With each pair, make a wonky cut roughly parallel to the hypotenuse as shown in photo 4.
Between each cut pair, switch the top portions and sew to the bottom portions, using the press mark to match the centers. Now each of the new triangles should be made of both fabrics. Press to the darker fabric. Use the corner of a ruler and align it with the top of each triangle, trim off excess as shown in photo 5.
- To make each of the small hourglass squares you need two of the side handle sections and both halves of one of the sand/air pairs. Arrange the pieces as shown in photo 6. First join together a handle piece to the neighboring sand/air piece, sewing from the inside point to the outer edge as the arrows in photo 6 show. Repeat with the other two pieces of the square. Press both pieces in the same direction - toward the darker fabric. Now sew the middle seam of the square - the centers should nest. Make four of these.

## Round Robin Mystery

## Round Robin Mystery 2021: Month \#6

Instructions to date:
Month \#1: Make a block as described in the January 2021 Block of the Month.
Month \#2: Add fabric to only two sides of your round \#1 block to make the block 16.75 " square. This round must also incorporate something from nature, be creative or be minimal, it is up to you.
Month \#3: Make two blocks following the instructions for the March 2021 Block of the Month. Cut these blocks in two diagonally so you have four triangles. Add the triangles to the four sides of your round robin block from February. This should give you a block approximately 24 " square.


Month \#4: Add a border to no more than two sides of your block. Incorporate triangles into this border in some manner. The final size of you quilt at the end of this round is approximately $24^{\prime \prime} \times 34$ ".

Month \#5: Make the Block of the Month block for May 2021. This is a 4 -square block - don't sew the four squares together. Use these four squares as cornerstones in the $6.5^{\prime \prime}$ border you add this month. The size of you quilt at the end of this round is approximately 36 " $X 46$ ".
New instructions: Add a 10" border to all four sides. Incorporate curves in this border. The size of you quilt at the end of this round is approximately $555^{\prime \prime} \times 65$ ".

If you are having trouble visualizing, we are doing a YouTube video each month where we are showing how we are implementing the instructions - but you can certainly do it differently.

## PHILANTHROPY UPDATE

## Hello quilters!

Thanks so much for your willingness to sew for philanthropy! It would be impossible to produce as many quilts and pillowcases as we do if not for others pitching in to help, so believe me, we really do appreciate the help.

Special thanks to President Shirley Brown for not only coordinating the picnic event (and to Adriane Ridder, Kristin Timm and Shelly McNeely for the location!), but also for handing out almost 100 pillowcase kits. I would have been there except I was (am) in Ohio with my quilting pal Jay Johnson, whom some of you know. Of course, we still have many more PC kits, so if you missed out or need resupplying (or picking up of completed kits), please text Lynn Korito to arrange delivery and/or pickup.

As you may know, we were able to give 60 baby quilts and assorted burping/changing pads to the lady veteran moms associated with the Women's Program at the Loma Linda VA. Thanks to many of us, we were able to make a significant contribution to their annual Mother's Day Baby Shower. Our efforts to do the same (or more) next year have already begun, and we have a couple of baby quilts completed as "seeds". If you enjoy making baby quilts, one of our goals for the 2022 Baby Shower is 75 quilts. We did not specify any minimum requirements for this past donation, but we were asked for some, so let's try to adhere to the following kind of loose guidelines: crib size (about $44^{\prime \prime} \times 50^{\prime \prime}$ ) or square (about $40^{\prime \prime} \times 40^{\prime \prime}$ ), recognizable baby/small child prints and colors. Machine applied bindings are fine.

Also ongoing:
--Twin size bed quilts for men at March ARB: minimum 64" x 80" please; can be somewhat wider and longer, but these are the minimum to be sure the quilt will fit the man's bed. Please try to avoid mixing in pinks and florals.
--lap size (or twin) quilts for local foster children of both sexes and all ages, infants to teens. (If making a baby foster quilt, it should be smaller than lap size, of course. And if you DO make a baby quilt you want to be donated to a foster child rather than the Baby Shower, please just let us know and we will deliver it accordingly.)

DON'T FORGET: if you have unwanted completed quilt tops (or even sets of blocks) that you would like to see finished and donated, please let us know! We can get them finished up and donated, and we are happy to do so.

Special thanks to Candy Flory-Barnes who has 10 quilt tops ready for us, PLUS 4 finished quilts, PLUS pillowcases! Thanks also to Jay Johnson (Ohio) who has donated a completed twin size quilt and an additional quilt top for a foster child. Thanks also to Patty Stagl (Illinois) who just quilted a vet quilt free of charge. None of these ladies are guild members!

Our usual and sincere gratitude goes out to Maryruth Wilson and Edna Wright for copious hours of quilting, to Lupe Barker and Gloria Bachmann for lots of sewing, and to Cathy Cochran for lots of binding! And to all of you who are busy sewing up pillowcase kits, and for holding needy veterans and foster children in your hearts, helping us to wrap them up in expressions of warmth and love. That is the spirit of philanthropy.
