#### **Sue Rasmussen is coming to Town!**

October marks the last month this year we will be entertaining speakers and offering a workshop to the guild. We are so very fortunate to corral Sue Rasmussen as she is planning to retire from the guild circuit at the end of this year! Hereafter, she will be available for private lessons and small groups by appointment or engagements of three days or more, to allow for more time in her studio and travel. Sue's classes will be offered at the Empty Spools Seminars in Asilomar in 2020. Their workshops begin at \$1,000 for those who reside off grounds, yet our class is just \$35 for guild members. For those who may be interested, contact of Workshop Chair, Lupe Barker. There are three spaces left!

Sue's specialty is curved piecing, specifically curved paper-pieced flying geese, yet her portfolio displays landscapes and pictorial quilts, art quilts, journal quilts and humorous quilts in addition to jackets and vests. The one-day class, being offered on the Wednesday after her lecture, will add another dimension to your paper piecing skills by learning how to design, draw, measure and sew a small quilt (18" x 21") using her special technique and the secrets to easy paper piecing she will share.

Sue has degrees in Textile Sciences and Agricultural Economics from UC Davis and has been quilting since 1988. Having completed hundreds of quilts since that time, many of her art and pictorial quilts and quilted clothing are exhibited nationally. Teaching elaborate piecing and free motion quilting techniques for over 25 years, Sue has been accepted in juried shows from Paducah to Tokyo and has won national and international awards. She has been a guest on "The Quilt Show", "Simply Quilts" and "The Carol Duvall Show" as well as having been commissioned to quilt for dozens of clients including Alex Anderson, Shery Craig and C&T Publishing. ## **President's Message**






Hello Fall... I am so happy that you are here! It's been a long crazy summer and I am ready for some pumpkin spice.




## 2019 Valley of the Mist Quilter's Guild Programs

**January 8, 2019 Lecture: Short Attention Span Trunk Show** January 9, 2019 **Wednesday Workshop: Miniature Landscape 101** 

This is a grand guilt and garment show, where Linda will bring about 30 guilts and a few ensembles with an emphasis on artistic techniques, artistry and poetry. Techniques demonstrated in the handson workshop include fabric painting, leaf painting, various methods of machine and hand appliqué, machine embroidery, thread painting, use of Solvy and disappearing medium as well as free motion quilting.

February 12, 2019 **Lecture: The Art of Silk Fusion** 

February 13-14, 2019 Midweek Workshop: Silk Fusion and Mosaics

Tamara, from Golden, Colorado, will provide a two-day workshop combining fibers with textile medium producing rich in luxurious shine and color. In this class, the students will create two silk fusion pieces which will then be used to create a mosaic on the second day. The \$60 workshop fee includes: silk tussah fibers, silk hankies, fabric medium, silk threads, Angelina fibers, gold leafing for embellishment, fiberglass screening, brushes and the plastic drop cloths for the fusion process.

March 12, 2019 **Lecture: Enjoying the Journey** 

March 16, 2019 **Saturday Workshop: Millennium Star** 

Peggy will teach a quick-strip paper piecing method using assembly-line piecing on fabric strips. Beginners find this method less confusing and easy to learn, while experienced guilters are delighted by this quicker, simplified technique. See her website for photos, and detailed descriptions and supply lists.

**Wendy Mathson** April 9, 2019

**Lecture: Storm at Sea - From Traditional to Contemporary** April 13-14, 2019 **Weekend Workshop: Storm at Sea** 

In another two-day workshop, Wendy will offer three pattern variations to make using the traditional "Storm at Sea" block, vastly simplified by learning a method of trimming as you sew, using squares and rectangles cut from strips. All patterns are supplied. Students are not required to purchase tools, books or kits.

May 14, 2019 **Lecture: Art Quilts for the Non-Artist** May 18, 2019 Saturday workshop: Spectrum 18" Square

Elizabeth's overall philosophy on teaching classes is this: students should go away with at least one new tip, or way of doing something. Some students may even have a finished project, if the chosen class is a mini-quilt or some other small quilt. But generally, it's most important that we quilters share some time together building our community, getting to know the other quilters in our guild, and enjoy the learning and making of a new quilt. This class will use a scrappy, traditional piecing technique to create a small 25" square quilt.

October 8, 2019 **Lecture: A Desperate Housewife's Quilt Journey** October 9, 2019 **Wednesday Workshop: Curved Paper Pieced Flying Geese** 

Students immediately move beyond the basic paper pieced geese, by adding a dramatic twist, to design a small guilt (18" x 24") with **curved** flying geese. In this class, you will learn to design, draw, measure and sew the pattern. Sue will discuss, in detail, the many options available for using curved flying geese in borders or as central design elements — opening up new horizons to curved paper foundation piecing.













#### **Block of the Month**

#### Block of The Month 2019: Block #10

Happy October! This month we are making a wonderful block: it's an improv interpretation of Gentleman's Fancy. Remember we are using our focus fabric, Modern Movement by Henry Glass (available at the guild meetings for \$2 per fat quarter.) You only need to use this fabric if you are turning in a block for the drawing. The blocks are due at the November 2019 meeting.

The fabrics you need this month are the focus fabric, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a grey fabric and a white fabric. You have lots of choices with this block, so get ready to be creative.

We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep. Also, the Guild's Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.

#### Cut list -- For one block

Focus fabric: One chunk, with four straight sides, they don't have to be parallel, each side

between 2 1/4" and 3 1/2" long.

Grey, white, and Use strips of these fabrics that vary from 1½" to 4" wide. This is a good use of coordinating-color fabric: scraps. We ask that you use at least two strips of each of these fabrics.

#### Assembling the block:

For this block you will be consecutively adding rounds to each side of the block. You start with your chunk of focus fabric. Each strip in a round should be of the same fabric. After pieces are sewn to each side, these are trimmed to create the edges for the next round. When choosing strip pieces, make sure they are slightly longer than the side you adding to – a half-inch extra on each end should be enough. You are only adding to the edges of the piece, not to the strips in the current round. See photo 3, it shows strips added to round 2, making round 3.

- Round 1: Use focus fabric piece and four strips of one of the other fabrics. Add a piece of fabric to each side and press to the newly added fabric. Then trim to form the next round by placing a ruler on a corner of the fabric the pieces were added to, roughly align the edge of the ruler 1/4" from the corner so it will trim two corners off of the round just added (see photo 2). Do this trimming on all four sides.
- Keep adding rounds in the same manner and trimming, but remember the strips used in each round should be the same fabric and you are adding to the edge you just trimmed.
- You may have rounds that when you go to trim the edges of the round, they don't meet. That is fine, trim as in photo 4 to make the edge for the next round.
- You need to add rounds until the measurement across each width is 7.75" to 8.5". At this point you use your square up ruler to estimate how wide the next strips need to be and they will most likely need to be about 3" to each side.
- Now after trimming, turn the block so that two of the pieces just added are on the top and bottom. Using your 12.5" square up ruler, you should see that you only need to add corners. If the width or height isn't at least 12.5", add another narrow round and then check again. Get triangle pieces and audition them to find pieces that will make the block large enough.
- Using the 12.5" square up ruler, square the block to 12.5". Move the ruler around until you find the final look you like best. Repeat to make a second block to keep! If this is confusing please watch the video.







## **2020 Opportunity Quilt**

#### LET'S GET TO WORK!! PHILANTHROPY NEWS YOU CAN USE

As you should know by now, there is a seemingly endless need for quilts and pillowcases for people in need. For example, we just found out from the good people at the Temecula Valley Assistance League that they aid 996 foster children in the area. NINE HUNDRED AND NINETY-SIX. That's a huge number, and they're all here in the area, and each of them could probably use a quilt made just for him or her. Foster children are of all ages, from infants up to 18, boys and girls. Member **Candy Flory-Barnes**, a quiet, unassuming, big-hearted woman who lives in Oceanside, has, this year to date, **made 144 pillowcases and six quilts.** These items were created entirely from her own stash. What a wonderful woman she is!! Thank you so much, Candy, on behalf of all the people who will receive your beautiful pillowcases and quilts, and on behalf of the guild and the philanthropy program in particular. You put us all in the shade!

We have been delivering much-needed quilts to various places already this month. Lynn delivered 35 pillowcases and 18 quilts to Casa de Paz/Alternatives to Domestic Violence, and then we found out they currently have 15 women and 40 children there. Lynn took 40 children's pillowcases and 21 quilts to the Temecula Valley Assistance League, and then we found out they assist 996 foster children. Lynn and Ellen made a trip up to March and delivered 20 twin size quilts and miscellaneous items such as bar soap, socks, cookware, towels and twin bed sheet sets. Then we found out that a very large number of men being housed in the new apartments arrive with absolutely nothing, and upon entry, of course, have no income. After they've been in the program awhile, they get trained and eventually go to work. Yet upon entry, U.S. Vets tries to give each man a welcome home gift of sheets, a pillow, a quilt or blanket, and assorted other things they need.

So, our work is cut out for us. Help us! If you'd like to donate fabric for pillowcases, we really appreciate complementary fabrics. If you buy a yard each of complementary fabrics, whether manly or juvenile, we can supply the contrast accent piece, no problem. If you'd like to make a twin size quilt for a man (we have plenty for women right now) or child, **please remember the minimum size requirement is 64" x 80".** Quilts can be a bit longer and/or a bit wider, no problem. Once you get into full-size territory, though, they're really too big.

October Philanthropy Workday is Saturday, October 26 at the Temecula Valley Assistance League meeting room, 10-3. 28720 Via Montezuma, Temecula, 92590. Bring your lunch and hydration!

Philanthropy quilts will be displayed at the Rancon Building at the quilt show.
