Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2018: Block #9

We are doing a simple block this month – after all it has been a busy time with summer over. This is another nine-patch variation with a four patch in the center. No triangles this month! The blocks are due at the October meeting.

The fabrics you need this month are our focus fabric -Effervescence – Wild by Robert Kaufman, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a black fabric and a white fabric.

We will be selling fat quarters of the focus fabric at the meetings for \$2 each. It should only take one fat quarter to make two of all the twelve blocks for this year.

We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing and one to keep.



Focus fabric: two 2½" squares Coordinating-color fabric: two 4½" squares

one 2½" X 18" strip Black: one 2½" X 18" strip

White: two 4 ½" squares two 2 ½" squares



Assembling the block:

- Use the photos for color placement and assembly help.
- To create the side-center units: sew black strip to coordinating color strip. Press toward black. Cut into four 4½" patches.
- Create the center four-patch using the two focus fabric squares and the two white 2 ½" squares. Press to the focus fabric.

Now the final assembly! Layout pieces in correct order as shown in photo one.

- Using a precise 1/4" seam allowance and right sides together, sew the horizontal rows together, alternate the pressing of the middle row with the top and bottom rows so the seams will nest in the next step.
- Keep rows in order and now sew rows together. The seams should nest and help keep patches aligned.
- Press seams and square the block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Repeat to make a second block to keep!

Good luck and even though this block is due in October we need you to turn in all your summer blocks (May, June, July, August) at the September meeting.

2019 Retreat News



For those that are new to our guild - close to the end of our meetings, members are invited to show off our newly finished or older (especially if it's been a long time since we've seen it) quilts. We all love seeing our members' projects (finished or unfinished). Plus, you earn a chance to win a prize at the end of the year by receiving a ticket for every quilt you bring. Remember that we are all at different levels of quilting and every quilt will be an inspiration to someone.

Please come to our table and sign the quilt name/description and your name into our register. Then sign a ticket for each quilt and place it in the jar. In **November**, we will have a drawing for the gift boxes we are preparing. We have tables in the back where we would like you to lay out your quilts that you will be showing so all can see them before the meeting and at break. When it's time to Show & Tell, just pick up your quilt (s) and line up close to the stage steps. We will help hold your quilt so you can be free to show us the details.

For **September**, please bring **Back to School** themes, **Kid** quilts, **Fall**, **autumn** quilts. For **October**, please bring **Harvest**, **Pumpkins**, and **Halloween** quilts

Remember, we always like to see your recently completed quilts regardless of the theme of the month.


