Linda Schmidt January 8, 2019 January 9, 2019

Lecture: Short Attention Span Trunk Show Wednesday Workshop: Miniature Landscape 101

This is a grand quilt and garment show, where Linda will bring about 30 quilts and a few ensembles with an emphasis on artistic techniques, artistry and poetry. Techniques demonstrated in the handson workshop include fabric painting, leaf painting, various methods of machine and hand appliqué, machine embroidery, thread painting, use of Solvy and disappearing medium as well as free motion quilting.





February 12, 2019 **Lecture: The Art of Silk Fusion**

February 13-14, 2019 Midweek Workshop: Silk Fusion and Mosaics

Tamara, from Golden, Colorado, will provide a two-day workshop combining fibers with textile medium producing rich in luxurious shine and color. In this class, the students will create two silk fusion pieces which will then be used to create a mosaic on the second day. The \$60 workshop fee includes: silk tussah fibers, silk hankies, fabric medium, silk threads, Angelina fibers, gold leafing for embellishment, fiberglass screening, brushes and the plastic drop cloths for the fusion process.

March 12, 2019 **Lecture: Enjoying the Journey** March 16, 2019 Saturday Workshop: Millennium Star

Peggy will teach a quick-strip paper piecing method using assembly-line piecing on fabric strips. Beginners find this method less confusing and easy to learn, while experienced quilters are delighted by this quicker, simplified technique. April 9, 2019 **Lecture: Storm at Sea - From Traditional to Contemporary** April 13-14, 2019 Weekend Workshop: Storm at Sea

In another two-day workshop, Wendy will offer three pattern variations to make using the traditional "Storm at Sea" block, vastly simplified by learning a method of trimming as you sew, using squares and rectangles cut from strips. All patterns are supplied. Students are not required to purchase tools, books or kits.


May 14, 2019 **Lecture: Art Quilts for the Non-Artist** May 18, 2019 Saturday workshop: Spectrum 18" Square

Elizabeth's overall philosophy on teaching classes is this: students should go away with at least one new tip, or way of doing something. Some students may even have a finished project, if the chosen class is a mini-quilt or some other small quilt. But generally, it's most important that we quilters share some time together building our community, getting to know the other quilters in our quild, and enjoy the learning and making of a new quilt. This class will use a scrappy, traditional piecing technique to create a small 25" square quilt.

Block of the Month

Block of The Month 2019: Block #5

Hello, it's hard to believe it's already May! We have a great block for you this month – an improv variation on the Churn Dash block. This block isn't due until the September meeting. If you are making a block to turn in then you need this year's focus fabric, Modern Movement by Henry Glass (available at the guild meetings for \$2 per fat quarter.)

The fabrics you need this month are the focus fabric, your coordinating fabric based on the colors in the focus fabric, a gray fabric and a white fabric.



We encourage you to make two blocks, one to enter in the drawing at the guild meeting and one to keep. Also, the Guild's Facebook page should have a post directing you to the YouTube instructions for this block.

Cut list -- For one block:

Focus fabric: one 41/2" square

Gray fabric: two $5\frac{1}{2}$ " X 5" rectangles White fabric: two $5\frac{1}{2}$ " X 5" rectangles

two 5½" squares

Coordinating-color fabric: two 5½" squares



Assembling the block:

- Let's make the gray and white units. Using the 5½" X 5" rectangles of the gray and the white fabrics, stack the four pieces with the right sides facing up, white on the bottom. You don't need a ruler, just a rotary cutter. Being careful not to cut yourself, make a cut across the 5" width, cutting the longer side roughly in half. See photo 2.
- Keep the fabric in two stacks, pick one stack and move the top two gray pieces to the bottom of that stack. Now sew these pieces together along the edge you just cut, right sides together. These may not align perfectly, but just match the top edge and sew the seam, adjusting the edge as you sew. Try to keep the seam at ¼", but don't worry the piece is oversized and will be trimmed. The four finished pieces should be approximately 5" square.
- Now let's make the corner half square triangles. Do the same as with the previous instructions but with the 5½" squares. Stack them right sides up with the white on the bottom and the coordinating fabric on top. Without using a ruler, make a rough diagonal cut from one corner to the opposite (be careful.) See photo 3. As before move the top two pieces from one stack to the bottom and with right sides together sew the diagonal seam.
- Take the finished pieces and stack as many as you feel comfortable trimming at once (I did four at a time) and even up two adjacent edges. See photo 4. You are going to trim a minimal amount from the two edges you lined up -- just enough to straighten them. Now turn the pieces and using a ruler, square them to 4½" along the other two edges. See photo 5. They should look wonky. Repeat until all these units are 4½"square.
- Now taking all pieces, arrange them in rows to match the final block. The white faces out on all the edges. See photo 6.
- Sew each row together, alternating the pressing direction. You do need a scant 1/4" seam now. Next, sew the rows together to get the final block. Press
- Use your 12.5" square-up ruler to check that your block is 12½ X 12½". Repeat to make a second block to keep!



2019 Challenge Quilt

2019 Valley of the Mist Quilt Guild CHALLENGE: "Quilter's Going Wild, appreciating Nature's Wildlife"

Judging Categories:

- 1. Originality and creativity of design
- 2. Best use of color
- 3. Excellence in workmanship

Judging shall be based on the following:

- 1. The guilt's focus is one or more wildlife creatures.
- 2. Each member may enter one (1) quilt in the Challenge show us your best!
- 3. The guilt is current, completed after September 2018.
- 4. Size of quilt has no minimum, but maximum size is a 240" perimeter (so all quilts can be displayed during judging and at the Old Town Quilt Show).
- 5. The quilt is made of our fave medium fabrics, either by hand or machine, sandwiched with batting, and quilted by hand, domestic or long-arm machine.
- 6. The quilt is labeled with quilter's name and date. The label shall be covered at judging time, using blue painter's tape preferred.
- 7. Quilter shall sign up to enter the Challenge, with the Challenge Coordinator Carole Donahoe at any Guild Meeting from February until August 2019, or by email to caroledonahoe@icloud.com.
- 8. Quilter shall have fun and enjoy challenging fellow quilters!



2019 Valley of the Mist Quilt Show

The Quilt Show Committee continues to work hard to make this year's Quilt Show a success. Our marketing bookmarks were introduced at the April meeting and we hope you were able to take some with you to help spread the word. The two-day event will begin Friday, October 4th (6:30- 8:30 pm) with an **Eleanor Burns 40 Fabulous Years of Quilting show**. If you haven't seen her show, you're in for a special evening of entertainment. I recently met a quilter from Orange Country and she mentioned she heard we had Eleanor's show coming to our guild. She had already seen the show and told me it was absolutely hilarious and definitely worth seeing. The word is getting out! The tickets for the show are \$20 for members and \$25 for non-members. The bookmark was designed to target the public so the \$25 price was used, but the price for members is \$20. Here's a summary of the volunteer opportunities for the Quilt Show:

- **Quilt donations are needed** for the auction and we hope you'll consider donating an auction quilt. There are options to provide full donation or receive back 50% or 25% (new this year) of the sale price. These options will help you recover some of the expense of making a quilt. You can also choose to set a minimum price so if it doesn't sell for the minimum set, we won't sell it and you'll receive the quilt back.
- **Handmade items are needed for our Boutique**. We hope you consider helping us in making handmade items and also attend the June 15th boutique sew-in day. Contact **Shelly Wilson** or **Karen Wurfel** for addition information or review the newsletter article about the boutique sew-in day.
- Volunteer to help in a variety of ways during the day of the Quilt Show on October 5th. There are many opportunities to work during the Quilt Show. As we get closer, **Janine Anderson** will have a sign-up sheets at guild meetings. Save the date so you can help!
- Participate in displaying your quilts all over Old Town during the Quilt Show. It's an amazing display of quilts if you haven't seen it yet. We need lots of quilts to fill the store fronts and balconies. These would be quilts you've already made and you would be responsible for hanging and retrieving your quilts or ask for help if needed. Please plan on helping us deck out Old Town.
- Participate in the Quilt Walk where we make arrangements with stores that wish to display theme related quilts in their stores from 9/21-10/5. Contact **Sheryl Eramo** for additional information.
- Participate in the Fiber Arts Display and Demonstrations. This event was a huge success last year and will be again this year. Contact Virginia Conkling for additional volunteer information.
- There are opportunities to display quilts in the **Grace Mellman Library** showcases. There are some specific qualifications and so it's best to contact **Paula McGaugh** if you're interested.
- If you know a business or someone who might be willing to sponsor our Quilt Show, please contact Laurie Gonzalez directly. She is looking for sponsors and can help explain this process.

The next Quilt Show meeting is schedule on **Friday May 17**th **at 1:00 pm** in the Grace **Mellman Library.** Everyone is welcomed even if you're just curious about the show!

A big thank you to everyone who helps us do the philanthropic work of the guild, even if that means you pick up one pillowcase kit and sew it together for us. We appreciate your help! If you ever feel like coming to our Saturday Work Day, we'd love to have you. Here's the poop on the when-and-where:

We typically meet the last Saturday of every month, with few exceptions. March was one of those exceptions, since the day was in the middle of the guild's retreat, and all of the people who would have picked up bins, etc. were at that retreat. **Also, in November we will meet the Saturday BEFORE Thanksgiving**.

We got a whole lot of pillowcase kits assembled at the retreat, and please note that **now we also have** <u>a few</u> <u>very easy quilt kits</u> also for your sewing pleasure. These are available to be checked out at the back of the room where we have all the rest of our stuff—quilts for quilting, quilts for binding, and pillowcase kits.

Big thanks to Candy Flory-Barnes for her personal pillowcase and guilt production for philanthropy!

We spent a combined total of 16 hours tidying and organizing the storage unit in April. Now we know what we have to use and where it all is! Big thanks to Todd, a family friend of Ida Colvin's, who was our dedicated muscle.

We are thinking hard about the organization of the August sew-in. If you are new to the guild, our August general meeting is a big Philanthropy Sew-In. We've done a lot of different things with the Sew-In in the past, so we're giving it a lot of thought in order to maximize our production that night. While the Mile-A-Minute was a lot of fun, and everyone learned a new use for smallish scraps, the fact is that Mile-A-Minute takes seemingly forever to get to visible production stage. So we will probably be planning to do something that generates blocks much faster this time around. We encourage you to disregard any vacation plans, and stay in town to participate! It's a lot of fun.

If you have an urge to help us on your own, and want to provide fabric for pillowcases, the standard pillowcase kit contains the following: 3/4 yard for the body, 1/4 yard for the cuff, and a 3" strip for the accent. NOTE: these are all selvage-to selvage measurements. If you donate two separate yards of coordinating fabric, we can always provide the accent strips, and get two pillowcases from your donation. And guess who has ideal coordinating fabrics? Cindee Ferris's new shop, Between Stitches, down in Old Town Temecula! We will accept any size quilt, of course, but there remains an on-going need for manly sort of twin-size bed quilts, as well as BOY QUILTS. The reason for this need is fairly simple: women quilters tend to buy the kind of fabrics they like, which are very often feminine colors and florals. So people tend not to have stashes of fabrics that might appeal to boys. When we say "boy quilts," we're talking little boy, between the ages of, say, 5-12. These quilts do not need to be made of car and truck or dinosaur fabrics, although those are always appropriate, but just definitely not girly. Colors that are always good are green, blue, yellow, red. You can throw in some purple. Twin size minimums are 64" x 80"+. We're not trying to be hardcore and rigid, we just want them to fit on a twin size bed. That said, again, we certainly accept quilts of other sizes.



Philanthropy, con't.

We continue to accept donations of items for the formerly homeless vets out at March ARB. Their needs are ground-up: they pretty much need everything. Your generosity in the past has been touching, and very much appreciated by the vets themselves as well as the folks at U.S. Vets who try so hard to help these veterans return to the world. 
- Twin size sheet sets
